

A BRIDGE TOO FAR: The bridge of people's sentiments is far from being crossed at Borim

A fight against land acquisition for the new Borim bridge at Loutolim has taken over all other major concerns

LOUTOLIM: The villagers of Loutolim haven't forgotten the sleepless nights spent grappling with ways to protect their ancestral agricultural land and the decision to take away this land without considering stakeholders' viewpoints, resulting in hundreds of farmers taking to the streets, weighs heavily on their minds.

THE NEW BORIM BRIDGE LAND ACQUISITION CONFLICT

The land acquisition process for the proposed new Borim bridge has left a lasting impact, highlighting the need for fair and inclusive decision-making that respects the heritage and livelihoods of those affected.

The revelation that the decision on who to vote for will hinge on this issue in Loutolim reflects a deep concern at the loss of identity and livelihoods.

NEW BORIM BRIDGE: TIMELINE OF DISCONTENT

► **Project:** Construction of a new, high-level Borim Bridge, along with approaches across River Zuari and a Bypass on NH 566. The length of the proposed bypass: 5.73 km

► **Construction Co:** Technogem Constructions Pvt Ltd, a Thane/ Maharashtra-based consultant company since 2016

► **Imp:** In 2017, Technogem Constructions conducted a geostatistical study for the bridge suggesting three different routes over River Zuari. The Union Road Transport Ministry had finalised the route between Loutolim and Borim.

► **Route:** Will connect Borim in Ponda taluka to Angadi, Loutolim in Salcete via Murme ward of Borim

► **Rs 306 cr:** Sanctioned funds to acquire land for approach roads to the proposed

new Borim bridge over the Zuari river

► **Oct 23:** The Union Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) issued notification for the acquisition of 39.3184 hectares (3,93,184 sq mtrs)

► **Objections and suggestions** sought from citizens interested in the land to be acquired, within 21 days, to the Special Land Acquisition Officer, PWD-National Highways (NH), Altinho, Panjim

► **Nov 23:** Ramiro Mascarenhas, representing the Loutolim residents reiterated their demand that the land acquisition notification for the bridge be withdrawn immediately

► **Villagers** have been critical of the govt for not involving the panchayat or villagers in project discussions

THE MAIN CONCERN

The plan is to build the bridge on stilts and columns. This will need the construction of an approach road for transporting materials. This would lead to the filling of Khazan lands and the destruction of agricultural fields.

There is no justification for pursuing development at the cost of environmental destruction. While bridges and roads can be rebuilt, the same cannot be said for agricultural land and the broader environment once they are destroyed

"The Delhi Police have traced the origin of the emails. I am assuring citizens of Delhi that the police are alert, getting leads, and will take strict action," Saxena said.

We are elderly and have to depend on tap water fully. It is extremely unfortunate that at the peak of summer, we have no water. Some of our friends from other parts of the village bring water for us in cans. Despite complaints, no action has been taken

Workers call for greater labour rights

AP, SEOUL: Workers, activists and others in Asian capitals and European cities took to the streets on Wednesday to mark May Day with protests over rising prices and government labour policies and calls for greater labour rights.

Police in Istanbul detained dozens of people who tried to reach the central Taksim Square in defiance of a government ban on marking Labour Day at the landmark location.

Indonesia's parliament last year ratified a government regulation that replaces a controversial law on job creation, but critics said it still benefits businesses.

The law was intended to cut bureaucracy as part of President Joko Widodo's efforts to attract more investment to the country, which is Southeast Asia's largest economy.

In Seoul, the South Korean capital, thousands of protesters sang, waved flags and shouted pro-labor slogans at the start of their rally on Wednesday. Organisers said their rally was primarily meant to step up their criticism of what they call anti-labour policies pursued by the conservative government led by President Yoon Suk Yeol.

On Wednesday, the people of Voddant, Vasco urged Chief Minister Pramod Sawant to

speak in Hindi even as the latter asked whether all those present understood Hindi.

A woman voter told the Chief Minister that she does not understand Konkani and requested him to speak in Hindi.

Sawant said, "Konkani nahi aati, wohi problem hai, baki logo ko Hindi

nahi aati. Hindi sabko aati hai, jyada log Konkani (speaking) hai mujhe lagta hai. Baad me ye log bolenge ki Goa ke bahar bhashan kar raha hu."

The Chief Minister then continued his speech in Konkani.

While the request had to be made to the Chief Minister to speak in Hin-

di, in March this year, Panchayat Minister Mauvin Godinho had advanced knowledge, "sensed the language of the crowd" and spoke in Hindi without anyone asking.

The Chief Minister stated that he had come here to appeal to all to vote and make Narendra Modi Prime Minister for

the third time. Only Modi can ensure development and provide water, roads, electricity and toilets to the people.

During his tour of the port town, Sawant addressed three corner meetings and a public meeting at Baina in support of party's South Goa candidate Pallavi Dempo.
