Red alert: Holiday for schools today

PANJIM: In the wake of heavy rains and the red alert issued by India Meteorological Department (IMD) Goa, the Directorate of Education on Sunday announced holiday for educational institutions from Nursery to Class XII on Monday, July 15.

Speaking to O Heraldo, Director of Education Shailesh Zingade said, "Earlier I had told that it was discretional for the school managements to declare holiday in case of water logging. But it was decided to declare holiday from Nursery to Class XII as heavy rains with winds are expected tomorrow. We are not taking any risk."

The IMD has extended the red alert issued till July 15.

stakes presidential election. Seventy-eight-year-old Trump was addressing his supporters at the packed outdoor election rally in Butler town on Saturday when bullets started flying. Video footage showed him grabbing his ear as shots were fired. Trump was seen with blood on his ear and cheek as he was rushed off the stage by Secret Service agents.

The crowd started screaming behind him and then someone yelled: "Get down, get down, get down, get down!" as Secret Service agents piled on top of Trump to shield him.


The shooting created chaos with people in the back of the venue immediately running to the exits.



CALANGUTE: In a shocking incident, a 69-year-old Arnaldo Soares, a resident of Orda, Candolim, was allegedly murdered by unknown assailants on the intervening night of Saturday-Sunday. His body was found with his throat slit on Sunday afternoon.
