POLICE FIND DECOMPOSED BODY OF M' RASHTRA NATIVE AT VARCA

MARGAO: The Colva police have registered a case of unnatural death after discovering the decomposed body of a man named Rohit Roy in his rented room at Reprawaddo, Varca. The case was registered under Section 194 of the BNSS.

The police were alerted by an unknown caller who reported that a man was unconscious in his room at Reprawaddo. Upon reaching the location, the police conducted an inquiry with the owner of the room, who revealed that the tenant, Rohit, had not been seen since August 8, and a foul smell was emanating from his room.

When the police forced open the door, they discovered that Rohit, originally from Chandrapur, Maharashtra, had committed suicide by hanging. The body was found in a highly decomposed state, indicating that the death had occurred several days earlier.

The police conducted the inquest panchanama on the spot. The body has been preserved at the South Goa District Hospital in Margao for medico-legal formalities.

MARGAO: Aggrieved members of the Jama Masjid in Margao have criticised the authorities for failing to address their complaints over alleged illegal takeover of the Jama Masjid Committee and have vowed to start a signature campaign, which they would submit to the government as well as the MLAs of Margao, Fatorda and Navelim.

Addressing media persons on Saturday evening, these members, who are citizens of Margao, pointed out that a new committee had been formed, allegedly without holding the mandatory elections and also by keeping the majority of the Masjid society members in the dark.

They questioned the role of the present committee chairperson, and that of new entrants who they allege have come in to create mischief.

They added that they had lived in harmony and the earlier committees had worked for the welfare of the community at large, while the present committee, which has been there for one year, is working for their own interests.

'Illegal road being constructed on hill, likely to affect spring at Calangute'

CALANGUTE: Even as talathis have been directed to keep a watch on illegal hill cutting and constructions along the slopes in the State, a road being constructed along the hill slope in Calangute has been a cause of concern.

scale hill-cutting is likely to adversely affect the famed natural spring known as Motan which is in close proximity of the area.

"This construction of a road on the hillside through property bearing survey no 87, 96, 92, 88, 90, 89, 46, 41 and 42 of village Calangute, which involves significant hill cutting is not only illegal but also highly detrimental to the pristine environment of our community. The construction of the road was stopped by the Collector North vide stop work order on February 21, 2021," the complaint stated. The road is being constructed despite the stay order.

"The removal of vegetation and soil from the hill-

side will increase the risk of soil erosion and landslides. Allowing such a destructive road will certainly pollute the natural spring water resource Motan spring which is in a close proximity of the said area.

"The hill cutting and subsequent environmental degradation will have severe and irreversible impacts. The road construction project appears to be driven solely by the interests of builders looking to raise a concrete jungle, disregarding the well-being of our village environment.

"The hillside is home to a variety of flora and fauna, some of which are unique to this area. The destruction of this habitat will lead to loss

of bio-diversity and disrupt the ecological balance.

The CCF alleged that no permissions/NOC from the Town and Country planning (TCP) Department under 17A has been obtained as required as the land is sloppy in nature. Besides there is no permission/NOC from forest department as the property is notified as private forest.

"In light of these concerns, we urge you to immediately halt the construction activities," the CCF stated in the complaint which has been sent to the chief secretary, chief town planner, PWD chief engineer, collector (North), director of panchayats, and other authorities.

24 arrested for illegal gambling at Calangute; cash and gambling articles seized

PANJIM: The Crime Branch of Goa Police have arrested 24 persons for allegedly being involved in illegal gambling at Calangute and also seized from them cash and gambling items worth Rs 5.4 lakh, which included Rs three lakh. According to police, the arrests were made after the accused were caught red-handed during a raid conducted near the Calangute market on Sunday, August 11, 2024.

The accused who hailed from Goa, Karnataka and Maharashtra were later released on bail. However, incidentally, one of the accused was injured after he tried to flee from the scene by jumping down from the building which was raided. He has been hospitalised.

The raid was conducted by a team led by PI Kishor Ramanan who is investigating the case under the overall Supervision of SP Crime Rahul Gupta, IPS.

Abandoned building in dilapidated condition demolished at St Inez

Authorities seek stability reports of other such buildings; dilapidated structures to be demolished after getting order from District Collector

PANJIM: The unoccupied building which had partially collapsed was completely demolished on Sunday by the authorities and the decision to do so was taken as a safety measure.

The demolition had started on Saturday night and was completed by Sunday evening. This the second building which has been demolished within a week. Last week, a house on MG Road was demolished because it caved in due to heavy rains.

Fear had gripped the locals after part of the dilapidated building collapsed on Saturday evening. Local residents said that two months back they had informed Corporation of the City of Panjim (CCP) and Taleigao Panchayat about the about 40-year-old building.

A local resident said, "Recently Chief Minister Pramod Sawant said the assembly that he will order for demolition of old buildings. But what about these type of buildings which are more dangerous? These type of buildings are coming up because government is giving opportunity to builders. Before constructing the building, soil testing should have been done. We had given a complaint to the CCP. District Collector should have taken note of it," he said.



He said there are other buildings also which need to be demolished.

Taleigao MLA Jennifer Monserrate said, "There are two houses next to the building. We will make sure that everything is done properly. The building belonged to some private person and we had sent him notices stating the building is unsafe. May be there would not have been follow up but from the CCP side I am sure a letter would have been sent to the owner."

After the incident took place, the site was also visited by Corporation of the City of Panjim (CCP) Mayor Rohit Monserrate and North Goa District Collector Sneha Gitte, IAS.

Rohit Monserrate said that stability report of other buildings will sought and if required they too will be demolished after getting order from District Collector.
