

AGENCIES, NEW DEL-HI: Amid spiralling nation-wide protests over the rape and murder of a trainee doctor at Kolkata's RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, the Supreme Court, directed the West Bengal government to show 'great sensitivity' towards peaceful protestors.

It categorically asked the West Bengal government not to 'unleash the power of the state' on peaceful protesters.

"Let not the power of the State of West Bengal be unleashed upon peaceful protesters. Let us deal with them with great sensitivity. This is a moment for national catharsis," the apex court said. The court said, "We expect that West Bengal govern-

"What was the principal doing? Why was this inaction to first pass this as suicide and not registering an FIR. Body is handed to the parents for cremation late in the night. On the next day, the doctors are on protest and a mob assembles at the hospital. The hospital is invaded and critical facilities are damaged. What was the police doing? A serious offence has taken place and the crime scene is within the hospital. The police should have protected the crime scene. How can the police allow vandals to enter the hospital? After the principal resigned, he is sent to another hospital," the bench said.
