Panchayat faces heat over Old Goa encroachments

Petitioner says commercial activities still on; HC seeks action-taken report

PANJIM: The Old Goa heritage area may be one of Goa's most treasured historical zones, but getting illegal encroachments removed from the UNESCO World Heritage Site is proving more difficult than it should be.

The Se Old Goa Village Panchayat has stated in the High Court that it has issued show-cause notices to the occupants of unauthorised structures and halted commercial activities, but the petitioner has disputed the local body's claim, asserting that such activities continue unabated.

The High Court of Bombay at Goa has now directed the village panchayat to submit an affidavit-in-reply within a week.

The public interest litigation (PIL) writ petition, filed by John Baptista Mascarenhas, seeks action against illegal encroachments and commercial activities in the prohibited zones surrounding the world heritage monuments at Old Goa.


During the hearing, the village panchayat's counsel, Sahish Mahambrey, informed the Court that notices had been served to the occupants of unauthorised structures, instructing them to immediately cease

CLAIMS & COUNTER-CLAIMS

- Claimed that occupants were instructed to cease all unauthorised activities and asserted that commercial activities were stopped

all unauthorised activities. He further claimed that commercial activities had been stopped.

However, the petition-

er's counsel, Adv Parag Wagle, contested this statement, maintaining that commercial operations were still ongoing

from these premises.

A division bench comprising Justice M S Karnik and Justice Nivedita P Mehta noted that the petitioner's concerns would be addressed after the village panchayat files its affidavit-in-reply, accompanied by an action-taken report, within the stipulated time frame.

Previously, a survey report by the Tiswadi Mamladar identified 54 illegal structures within the prohibited areas at Old Goa, some of which were reportedly being used for commercial purposes.

Haryana BJP chief, singer Rocky booked for gangrape

PTI, SHIMLA/CHANDIGARH: Haryana BJP chief Mohanlal Badoli and a singer were booked after a woman alleged that she was gang-raped by them in a hotel in Kasauli. Himachal Pradesh Police has registered an FIR against the two men, officials said on Tuesday.

PTI reached out to Badoli but no response was received.

According to the complainant, the two men made videos of the act and threatened to kill the victim if she disclosed the incident to anyone, they said.

The FIR registered in Kasauli in Solan district on December 13, 2024, names Badoli and Jai Bhagwan alias Rocky. A copy of the FIR was doing the rounds on social media on Tuesday.

According to the FIR, the woman was staying in a hotel in Kasauli with her boss and friend when they met the two accused on July 3, 2023. While Badoli introduced himself as a political leader, Rocky introduced himself as a singer.

Later, the woman and her friend went into a room with the two accused, who promised to help the complainant get a government job and a chance to feature in a music video, the FIR said.

Kerala horror: 44 nabbed for athlete's rape

PTI, PATHANAMTHITTA (KERALA): The special investigation team (SIT) of Kerala police probing the sensational case of alleged sexual abuse of a Dalit girl in the district has arrested 44 people so far in connection with the matter, a senior police officer of the district said on Tuesday.

DIG S Ajeetha Begum, who is overseeing the investigation, said that 30 FIRs have been registered in connection with the alleged sexual assault of the girl and out of the 59 accused mentioned in the cases, 44 have been arrested.

"Two of the accused are absconding. They are abroad at present. We are considering issuing Look out Circulars for them. We are also planning to issue a Red Corner notice for them through Interpol," the officer told TV channels.

Besides them, 13 more have to be arrested, she said.

"We are searching for their locations. They will be arrested soon. A foolproof and scientific investigation will be carried out by the SIT. We will not spare any of the accused. There will be no compromise. We will bring all of them before the law," the officer said.

The investigation so far has revealed that several of the accused met the girl at a private bus stand in Pathanamthitta. She

was then taken to various locations in vehicles and subjected to abuse, police said.

The probe also found that the girl, while she was studying class XII last year, was taken by a youth who was acquainted with her through Instagram to a rubber plantation in Ranni, where he raped her along with three others.

Parl panel to summon Meta over poll remarks

HIGHWAY EXPANSION AT PORVORIM

Translocated trees fighting for survival, claims activist

Blames Doctor Trees for hasty translocation, mishandling of the process

PANJIM: In a scathing critique of the state government's actions, concerned citizens have condemned the destruction of trees during the construction of the elevated corridor at Porvorim. The backlash follows an affidavit filed by Telangana-based Doctor Trees India Private Limited before the High Court of Bombay at Goa, detailing the measures taken to protect three translocated trees.

Activist Avertino Miranda voiced his outrage, calling the translocation of five aged trees - including two banyan trees - as part of the ongoing six-lane elevated corridor project a "disastrous" move. He alleged that one of the translocated trees

had been attacked by mites and that the authorities had ignored crucial guidelines set by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways

(MoRTH), particularly the three-month pre-treatment period for the trees.
