NorthEast United play out gripping draw with FC Goa

GUWAHATI: Hosts PTI, NorthEast United FC came from behind to hold FC Goa 1-1 in a closely-contested Indian Super League (ISL) match here on Tuesday.

Mohammad Yasir handed the lead to FC Goa in the 65th minute but Jithin MS struck in the 76th minute for NorthEast as the two sides took one point each from the match.

This was the 11th draw between these two teams, the most number of stalemates between two side in this competition's history. The Highlanders start-

ed the game on the front foot as the likes of Guillermo Fernandez and Alaaeddine Ajaraie made some marauding runs, keeping the FC Goa defenders on their toes.

However, the first real opportunity came to the Gaurs when Dejan Drazic found Armando Sadiku with a telling cross in the
