### **BICHOLIM POLICE TRACE RASH DRIVER** IN FATAL ACCIDENT CASE

**PANJIM:** Bicholim Police received information on January 17 regarding a rashly driven blue car that rammed into a pedestrian, 75-year-old Shambhu Ramnath Tari, near Amona Bridge in Bicholim. The driver fled the scene without providing medical aid or notifying the authorities. The victim succumbed to his injuries while being treated at GMC Bambolim. Upon receiving the information, Bicholim Police formed teams to trace the driver. After extensive efforts and technical analysis, they identified the driver as Navin Govind Gawade, 34, from Bhironda, Sattari, The car involved in the incident, was seized. An FIR was filed under the relevant sections. PSI Viraj K. Dhauskar is leading the investigation under the supervision of Police Inspector Dinesh Gadekar.

#### THEFT REPORTED AT NEXA SHOWROOM IN ARLEM, RAIA

MARGAO: Savio Araujo of Borda, Fatorda, filed a complaint with the Maina-Curtorim Police Station regarding a theft at the Nexa Showroom near the RTO office in Arlem, Raia. Four accused individuals forcibly entered the showroom by cutting through the wire mesh fencing and stole a safe locker containing approximately Rs 93,571 in cash. An offence has been registered in the case, but no arrests have been made so far.

#### MAHARASHTRA POLICE ARREST MURDER **ACCUSED IN SOUTH GOA**

MARGAO: Maharashtra Police, in collaboration with the Colva Police, arrested two murder suspects wanted in connection with a case reported in Umarga, Maharashtra. PSI Pujarwad of Umarga Police Station requested assistance from the Colva Police, leading to the apprehension of Vikas Jamdar (also known as Nilesh), 26, and Akash Sahadev Mutle, both from Umarga, Maharashtra, at Betalbatim. The accused were taken into custody for further proceedings as required by the Maharashtra Police.

#### CHHATTISGARH MAN ARRESTED FOR ATTEMPTED ATM THEFT AT MAPUSA

MAPUSA: A 26-year-old man from Chhattisgarh, Raju Tirki, was arrested for attempting to break into an ATM at Xavier Complex, Alto, Mapusa, on January 15, 2025. Using a metal rod, Tirki attempted to force entry into the ATM counter but was unable to access the cash. The Branch Manager of HDFC Bank, Swati Naik, filed a complaint regarding the incident. An FIR has been filed, and the investigation is led by PSI Abhijit Naik.
