

Brison's strike pushes FC Goa to 2nd spot

FATORDA: FC Goa returned to winning ways in the Indian Super League edging past East Bengal FC with a narrow 1-0 victory at the Nehru Stadium, here, on Sunday.

In what is becoming a regular occurrence in the ongoing 2024-25 season, Brison Fernandes once again emerged as the defence-maker with a well-taken goal in the first half.

The Gaurs started brightly, and it took just 13 minutes for them to break the deadlock.

A cleverly worked short corner between Borja Herrera and Boris Singh caught East Bengal's defence off-guard. Herrera's pinpoint cross found Brison, whose deft header lobbed over an onrushing Prabhsukhan Singh Gill to find the back of the net.

It marked the youngster's sixth goal of the league season, and the 10th goal overall for him in the Club's colours. East Bengal, though stunned, responded well,

with Vishnu PV and Richard Celis

driving their attack. FC Goa's goalkeeper Hrithik Tiwari and their defensive unit were up to the task, however, repeatedly thwarting the visitors.

The Men in Orange came close to doubling their lead in the 35th minute when Iker Guarrotxena unleashed a thunderous shot from 30 yards that beat Gill but struck the post. Brison was quick to react to the rebound, but Gill redeemed himself with a superb save.

The second half saw

East Bengal ramp up the pressure, with Celis and Naorem Mahesh Singh creating multiple scoring opportunities. However, Hrithik Tiwari stood tall in goal, pulling off a series of outstanding saves, including a diving effort in the 67th minute to deny Celis from close range.

FC Goa's chances of extending their lead were squandered, with Armando Sadiku missing some clear opportunities, including a sliced effort from right in front of goal in the 75th minute. The Albanian striker's night went from bad to worse when he was sent off in stoppage time for a rash challenge, leaving his team to hold on with 10 men in the final moments.

Despite the visitors' dominance in the second half, FC Goa's defence held firm, ensuring that Brison's early strike proved decisive. The victory extended the Gaurs' unbeaten run to 11 matches and propelled them to second place in the standings with 30 points from 16 games.

With the league now heading towards its most important phase, Manolo Marquez and his boys will now look to continue their momentum when they host Chennaiyin FC coming Saturday.

JAIPUR: Dempo Sports Club ended their three-match losing streak with a hard-earned 1-1 draw against Rajasthan United in their ninth-round I-League 2024-25 clash at the Vidyadhar Nagar Stadium, here, on Sunday.

The result sees Dempo SC secure their first point of the year, taking their tally to 11 points and staying within striking distance of their hosts, who sit one point ahead with 12. After a tense and cagey first half, young goalkeeper Ashish

Sibi found himself in the spotlight.

The Dempo SC custodian was involved in a dramatic sequence of events that defined the opening period.

In the 31st minute, Sibi spilled a cross from Alain Oyarzun under pressure from Naoba Meitei, allowing Gerard Artigas to pounce and give Rajasthan United the lead.

However, Sibi displayed remarkable resilience to bounce back just minutes later. In the 38th minute,

he produced a heroic save to deny Oyarzun's penalty, diving sharply to his right and pushing the ball clear to keep Dempo SC in the game.



The penalty had been awarded after a chaotic goal-mouth scramble, but Sibi's intervention proved pivotal, inspiring his teammates to fight back.

The second half saw Dempo SC grow into the game, stifling Rajasthan's attacking efforts while

mounting dangerous moves of their own. Their persistence bore fruit in the 76th minute when Shaher Shaheen found the equaliser. Pruthvesh Pednekar's intelligent header set up the Syrian midfielder, who arrived at the far post to slot home from close range and ignite celebrations among the visitors.

Rajasthan United pushed hard for a late winner, with Gerard Artigas coming close in stoppage time, but his header drifted just wide of the far post. Dempo SC's defence held firm, ensuring they returned to Goa with a valuable point.
