Bumrah continues to top ICC Test ranking for bowlers



PTI, DUBAI: India's pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah continued to remain the undisputed No. 1 Test bowler, while Ravindra Jadeja maintained his top spot in the all-rounders' category, in the latest ICC rankings released on Wednesday.

Bumrah, who had made history ahead of the fifth and final Border-Gavaskar Test against Australia in January by recording the highest-ever ICC Rankings rating for an Indian bowler at 907 points, is currently on a career-best points tally of 908.

Australia's Pat Cummins (841) and South Africa's Kagiso Rabada (837) are placed second and third respectively.

Pakistan's Noman Ali (761) broke into the top-10 after an impressive six-wicket haul in the first Test against the West Indies in Multan.

There was no movement to the top-10 all-rounders list in the Test format, with Jadeja (400 ratings points) retaining the top spot, followed by South Africa's Marco Jansen (294) and Bangladesh's Mehidy Hasan (263).

MEN'S SINGLES Novak Djokovic vs Alexander Zverev: Jannik Sinner vs Ben Shelton

Sinner is bidding to defend a Grand Slam title for the first time after beating Daniil Medvedev in the final last year. He also won the US Open last year. The 22-year-old American

Shelton booked his place in the semi-finals in Melbourne for the first time with a battling 6-4, 7-5, 4-6, 7-6 (7/4) win over unseeded Italian Lorenzo Sonego. Left-hander Shelton put in

an all-action display to match his best performance at a major, having reached the US Open semi-finals in 2023.

Shelton unleashed the joint-fastest serve of the tournament, a monster ace clocked at 232kph (144mph), and afterwards turned his fire on the postmatch televised interviews that the winners do on court. Five-time Grand Slam champion Swiatek edged closer to a first Australian Open crown with an emphatic 6-1, 6-2 victory over American eighth seed Emma Navarro on a gusty Rod Laver Arena.

The 23-year-old world number two, who is building up a head of steam, plays American 19th seed Madison Keys in the women's semi-finals, which both take place on Thursday. Two-time defend-

ing champion and top-ranked Aryna Sabalenka plays Spain's 11th seed Paula Badosa for the other final berth.

Crasto-Kapila enter mixed doubles second round

PTI, JAKARTA: Young Tanisha Crasto and Dhruv Kapila started their mixed doubles campaign at the USD 475,000 Indonesia Masters Super 500 badminton tournament on a bright note, progressing to the second round with a straight-game win over their rivals, here, on Wednesday.

Crasto and Kapila defeated the Indonesian combination of Adnan Maulana and Indah Cahya Sari Jamil 21-18 21-14 in their opener to set up

a clash against Malaysia's Pang Ron Hoo and Su Yin INDONESIA Cheng next.

MASTERS On Tuesday, Crasto also entered the second round of the women's doubles partnering seasoned Ashwini Ponnappa. The pair defeated Thailand's Ornnicha Jongsathapornparn and Sukitta Suwachai 21-6 21-14 and will next meet Malaysia's Pei Kee Go and Mei Xing Teoh.

The other Indian mixed doubles pair of Rohan Kapoor and Ruthvika Shivani Gadde, however, bowed out in the first round, losing 9-21 13-21 against England's Gregory Mairs and Jenny Mairs.

The start to the day was far from rosy for India as both 2023 Odisha Masters runner-up Ayush Shetty and Kiran George lost their men's singles opening-round matches.

Shetty gave a tough fight to world

No.1 and twin Asian Games gold medallist Shi Yu Oi of China before going down 19-21 19-21, while Kiran George lost 12-21 10-21 against Jeon Hyeok-jin of Korea.

Later in the day, Lakshya Sen will be up against Takuma Obayashi of Japan, while Priyanshu Rajawat will play another Japanese in Kodai Naraoka.

It was not a good start for India in women's singles too as Rakshitha Sree Santhosh Ramraj lost 17-21

19-21 against Japanese Tomoka Miyazaki in the opening round, while Tanva Hemanth bowed out 14-21 11-21 to Thailand's Ratcha-

nok Intanon.

Two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu will open her campaign against Vietnam's Thuy Linh Nguyen later in the evening.

Star Indian men's doubles pair of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty sailed into the second round with a clinical 21-16 21-15 win against Chinese Taipei's Chen Zhi Ray and Lin Yu Chieh.

The Asian Games champions, who reached back-to-back semifinals at Malaysia Super 1000 and India Super 750 in the last two weeks, will face the Thai combination of Kittinupong Kedren and Dechapol Puavaranukroh next.
