SIOLIM BASED CLUB BOOKED FOR VIOLATING SOUND POLLUTION NORMS

MAPUSA: Anjuna Police have registered a case against Siolim-based Thalassa Club for allegedly violating sound pollution norms on Wednesday, January 23, 2025, night. Goa Pollution Control Board filed a complaint stating the club played music beyond the permissible limit and the sound was found reading 67.6dB & 71.7 dB respectively. Hence there was a violation with regards to the sound level, thereby causing Noise Pollution in the locality, the police said, the case is under investigation with Sandesh Chodankar, SDPO, Mapusa.

TALEIGAO RESIDENT HELD IN ATTEMPT TO MURDER CASE

PANJIM: The Old Goa Police have arrested Akash Mudraj, a Taleigao resident, for assaulting a Chimbel resident. According to police, Nagraj Bani, 34, resident of Indira Nagar Chimbel, lodged a complaint stating that Akash and Adil Makandar and Akhatar Mulla, both from Chimbel, hatched a conspiracy and Akash assaulted him with beer bottle and sickle (koita) due to which he sustained multiple injuries. The incident occurred on January 18, 2025. An FIR was registered and a team was formed to trace the alleged accused. The team succeeded in arresting Akash Mudraj on January 22, 2025. The accused was produced before JMFC, Panjim, which

remanded him to four days' police custody. Police said the accused was involved in other assault cases in the past also and was absconding after committing the recent crime.

UP NATIVE HELD FOR STEALING ELECTRIC CABLES WORTH RS 50,000

PANJIM: The Old Goa Police have arrested Rajesh Kumar, 30, a native of Uttar Pradesh for allegedly stealing electric cables worth Rs 50,000 and recovered the stolen item from him. According to police, Prasad Prabhu, Asst Engineer of Electricity Department, Bambolim, had lodged a complaint stating that an unidentified person stole Polycab Electric 4 core 100 Volts LT Street Light Cables which were lying in the trench for testing. A team was formed and the alleged accused was arrested on January 22, 2025. Further investigation is in progress, police said.

CALANGUTE POLICE ARREST BIJAPUR NATIVE WITH GANJA WORTH RS 95.000

CALANGUTE: The Calangute Police have apprehended a 24-year-old man, Sachin Rathod, from Bijapur, Karnataka, for alleged possession of ganja worth Rs 95,000. During a raid conducted on the night of January 22 at Naikawado, police discovered Rathod in possession of 950 grams of ganja. An FIR has been registered, and the case is currently under investigation by PSI Apeksha Usapkar of Calangute Police Station.

Meanwhile, as part of an ongoing crackdown on touts, the Tourism Department imposed a fine of Rs 5,000 on Thursday on Prakash Chavan, a resident of Bijapur. Chavan was detained by the tourist police for harassing tourists at Calangute beach.

MARGAO SHOPKEEPER ALLEGES THREAT BY FAKE TAX OFFICER

MARGAO: A shop owner in Margao, Gaja Rajput, has filed a complaint with the Margao police, alleging that an unknown individual impersonated a trade tax officer and demanded payment via online transaction. The accused allegedly threatened the shop owner with dire consequences. Based on the complaint, the police have registered an offence under Sections 351(4), 308, and 319(2) of the BNS 2023. However, no arrests have been made so far. Further investigation is being carried out by PSI Subhash Gaonkar of Margao Town Police Station.

Allegations of land fraud against Kavalem Mutt Swami, advocate, dismissed as 'election stunt'

PONDA/PANJIM: The Advocate of Kavalem Mutt, Manohar P Adpaikar, has denied allegations of impersonation, cheating, and forgery filed against him, the 77th pontiff of Kavale Mutt, Shree Shivanand Saraswati Swami, and Math Attorney Avadhut Shivram Kakodkar.

The allegations stem from an FIR registered at Ponda Police Station on January 15, 2025, based on a complaint by Bhushan J Jack and Dr P S Ramani. The complaint accuses the trio of fraudulently executing a Power of Attorney (POA) on February 20, 2018, and misusing it to sell Mutt property located at Queula village, Ponda, on March 20, 2018.

The complainants allege that the POA, purportedly executed by Shree Shivanand Saraswati Swami, fraudulently used the name of his predecessor, Srimant Satchidananda Saraswati, the 76th pontiff of the Mutt,

THE KAVALEM MUTT

Shri Gaudapadacharya Mutt, also known as Kavalem Mutt, is located in Ponda, and is the oldest Mutt of the Smarthan Saraswat Brahman Samaj. It was founded by Gaudapada around 740 AD, who was the guru of Govinda Bhagavatpada, the teacher of Adi Shankaracharya, a highly influential figure in Hinduism. There is a belief that Gaudapada himself established the Shri Gaudapadacharya Mutt during his time in Gomantak (Goa). Consequently, the Mutt came to be known as Shri Sansthan Gaudapadacharya Mutt. Shree Shivanand Saraswati Swami is the current and 77th pontiff of the Guru Parampara

MORJIM: Flippered visitors sparked some excitement ≥ for the first time in 2025 after they laid around 115 eggs along the Anjuna Vagator beach belt and kicked off the nesting season for Olive Ridley turtles.

Forest officials have shifted the clutch of eggs to the nesting site at Morjim for safety purposes.

Officials from the Forest Department have been camping for the last 3 days at this stretch and keeping a close watch on the movements of the turtles and finally discovered quite a number of eggs laid by the visitors.

According to locals and forest officials, the possible crackdown on loud music has enabled the turtles to come to the shore to lay their eggs however in what could be a disappointing factor is some unruly tourists who drink and make noise late in the night also drive their vehicles along the beach

Local tourists becoming a 'nuisance' in Calangute: sarpanch

Says unregulated water sports activities, influx of domestic tourists more of a bane than boon

CALANGUTE: The state government and the tourism department must take urgent measures to address the decline in tourism, particularly in Calangute, said Sarpanch Joseph Sequeira. Speaking to the media on Thursday, Sequeira highlighted several issues affecting the Calangute-Candolim beach belt, ranging from assaults on tourists by beach shack workers to accidents involving watersports operators. "All these tourism-related activities on the beach, like beach shacks and watersports, are directly under the control of the tourism

the region. "When tourists enter Goa, they head to Calangute. How can we stop anyone from coming to Calangute? So, everyone comes. I have put a proposal to the state government that all these jeeps that are coming should be checked to see if they have hotel reservations. I suggested setting up four checkposts at the entrance of Calangute. It is still pending. Our government is not interested-it is still under consideration," he remarked. He further alleged that

Sequeira also criticised the proliferation of cheap and illegal biryani stalls, which he said were harming tourism stakeholders. "A lot of people come in cars and jeeps, park, go to the beach, use public toilets, buy Rs 100 biryanis, sleep on the beach, and leave. Where is the business for the public of Calangute? Where is tourism? Earlier, guests who came to Calangute would spend around Rs 1,000 on food. Now it's gone from Rs 1,000 to Rs100," he said, emphasising that such tourists do not contribute to the tourism industry.

Sequeira called for immediate intervention from the government to address these challenges and revive tourism in Calangute, which was once a preferred destination for both domestic and international tourists.
