India's first Intertidal Bioblitz 2025

The Coastal Conservation Foundation (CCF) and the East Coast Conservation Team (ECC) will organise 'India Intertidal Bioblitz 2025', a week-long event aimed at exploring and documenting the incredible biodiversity of India's intertidal habitats. This citizen science exercise will simultaneously engage participants across the country.

A Bioblitz is an intensive, collaborative effort to document as many species as possible within a specific area and timeframe. India Intertidal Bioblitz 2025 will focus on the dynamic and diverse habitats in the intertidal zone - the region between high and low tide lines that teem with unique flora and fauna. Scientists, educators, and nature enthusiasts will work together to collect valuable data, share knowledge, and celebrate the rich biodiversity of these habitats. No prior scientific experience is needed. Registration is free, and participants will receive event schedules, identification guides, online sessions on how to participate and tips for fieldwork.
