

FC Goa close gap with top-placed Mohun Bagan Super Giant

FATORDA: FC Goa showcased their dominance once again with a thrilling 2-0 victory over Chennaiyin FC in the Indian Super League match played at the Nehru Stadium, here, on Saturday.

The Gaurs, spurred on by a raucous home crowd right from kick-off, delivered a scintillating performance that saw them consolidate their second position on the Indian Super League table with 33 points from 17 matches, inching closer to league leaders Mohun Bagan.

ISL The game began with FC Goa firing on all cylinders, setting the tone for an electrifying evening.

With the referee blowing his whistle to signal the start of proceedings, the hosts wasted no time in testing Chennaiyin FC's defence. Just four minutes in, Boris Singh came tantalisingly close with a shot that whizzed past the far post after a brilliant build-up play involving Rowlin Borges, Brison Fernandes and Aakash Sangwan. A minute later, Borja Herrera's attempt to capitalise on a defensive lapse was denied by a goal-line clearance, keeping the visitors in the game.

FC Goa's relentless pressure finally paid off in the 11th minute. A corner from Borja was partially cleared, only for Boris to whip in a dangerous cross. Chennaiyin FC goalkeeper Mohammad Nawaz, under pressure, failed to hold onto the ball after a collision with a teammate. Brison pounced on the

loose ball and struck the post, but Iker Guarrotxena was at hand to calmly slot home the rebound, registering his third goal of the season and giving his team a deserved lead.

FC Goa then doubled their advantage in the 26th minute, courtesy of Aakash Sangwan. Carl McHugh's exquisite long ball from midfield found the left-back in stride. Aakash controlled the ball deftly before firing past Nawaz from a tight angle, scoring his first goal in FC Goa colours against his former club.

The first half could have seen more goals for the home side, with Rowlin Borges and Iker both coming close. However, Chennaiyin FC managed to keep the deficit to two as the

half-time whistle blew.

Following the change of ends, FC Goa continued their dominance, though the intensity of their attacks dipped slightly. Iker and Borja combined well to create chances, but Chennaiyin FC's defence managed to hold firm. In the 69th minute, Farukh Choudhary had a rare chance for Chennaiyin FC, but his shot sailed over the bar, summing up their frustrating night.

Late in the match, Aakash and substitute Muhammed Nemil both came close to adding a third for the Gaurs, but Nawaz denied them with some fine saves.

Chennaiyin FC tried to push forward in the final minutes, with both Connor Shields and Daniel Chima

missing opportunities to reduce the deficit.

The victory not only kept FC Goa's title hopes alive but also extended their unbeaten run to 12 matches. With 33 points, they now trail leaders Mohun Bagan by just four points, keeping the race for the ISL League Shield wide open. The Men in Orange will next face Jamshedpur FC away on Sunday, February 2, as they will surely aim to continue their remarkable form.

Churchill Brothers shocked in add-on time

Artigas delivers the winner (90+3) deep into the add-on time of the second half for Rajasthan United FC

PTI, JAIPUR: Rajasthan United FC shocked Churchill Brothers 1-0 in their I-League match at the Vidyadhar Nagar Stadium, here, on Saturday.

The loss was Churchill Brothers' second of the New Year. Spanish striker Gerard Artigas delivered the winner (90+3) deep into the add-on time of the second half.

The defeat came as a double blow for the visitors as it also cost them the top position they were occupying in the league table. While Namdhari FC, who outclassed Shillong Lajong FC in the day's first match, are now top-pers with 20 points, the Goa side have dropped to the second place with 19 points from 10 outings.

Rajasthan United meanwhile moved up to fourth place with 14 points in

their kitty from nine matches. The win extended the Desert Warriors' unbeaten streak to five games, in which they have bagged 11 points.

After a shocking loss to open the New Year, Churchill Brothers' form reset to the normal and the league top-pers were hoping to extend their lead after Inter Kashi's loss the prior evening.

Rajasthan United though were not an easy case to crack, unbeaten in four and putting together a run of results that not just belied their early season form but also had slowly turned it around.

Predictably, the visi-

tors were the ones who started off brighter, and in a first half devoid of much real goalmouth action, were the ones who conjured up the big chances of the period.

The first chance arrived seemingly on a platter for Kingslee Fernandes, the forward's run at the far post picked out with a perfect cross from the left. He volleyed high.

Neither team had adequately tested the goal-keepers with long balls and set pieces, often headed clear or easily gathered in goal. It took till the opening minutes of the second half for both sides to really put together a run of play that looked dan-

gerous, Rajasthan United's Naoba Meitei first testing Sayad Abul Kadir from a tight angle after a run into the box.

Off the counter attack, Churchill Brothers almost got the opener, Lamgoulen Hangshing's cutback from the right falling in the path of Kingslee running into the box. The forward's shot was on target, but bounced off a clueless defender blocking the goal.

The game wore on without either side able to break through, half chances also petering out to few and far between. Arguably the best chance fell to Churchill's Nishchal Chandra in the 88th minute, when a half cleared corner fell at his feet inside the six yard box. Facing a narrow angle and a rapidly shutting window of opportunity, he volleyed high.
