PANJIM: Bardez and surrounding areas will finally receive tap water after a five-day shortage, following successful intervention by the Water Resources Department. With the help of Navy divers, the department has managed to open the jammed gates of Amthane dam in Bicholim, which will now allow water to flow to the Assonora water treatment plant.

PANJIM: Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on Wednesday said that the government has taken over the Kerim Plateau land under new Special Economic Zone (SEZ) policy and a clean project will come up on the site.

PANJIM: A man from Uttar Pradesh has been arrested by the Cyber Crime Police for extorting money from a Siolim resident by threatening her with a fake police complaint. The Cyber Crime Police

Station registered a case under various sections of the BNSS and the IT Act after the victim was duped by an unknown person who impersonated a Delhi Crime Branch police inspector. The victim was informed that a police complaint had been filed against her and was sent forged letters in the name of the Supreme Court of India. Nirmala urges govt to request for exclusive date on Mhadei issue

PANIIM: Former Minister and Mhadei Bachao Abhiyan (MBA) convenor Nirmala Sawant on Wednesday urged the State government to request the Supreme Court for an exclusive date for the hearing of Mhadei river matter. In a press statement released ahead of the Mhadei matter in listed for hearing in the Supreme Court on Thursday, Sawant said, "Given that the matter is now at number 112 on the list, there is little chance for the Su-

preme Court to reach that number. Why can't the Goa government request the Supreme Court for an exclusive date for the hearing? The State government

wants to demonstrate to the people of Goa how much concern the government has for Mhadei, so they are sending nearly half a dozen lawyers in ad-

dition to those from Mumbai and Delhi. There is a significant number of government officers present, as if it were a trial court, Sawant said.

The MBA convenor alleged that the State government was misleading the people of Goa, but they cannot continue to do so indefinitely at the cost of the government exchequer.
