

## GFA directs clubs to obtain new cards for players

**PANJIM:** The Goa Football Association on Thursday announced that the revised private inter-village football tournament rules have come into force with effect from January 2025.

All the clubs should direct their players to obtain new inter-village cards by submitting an application form along with their old inter-village cards and following mandatory doc-

A copy of the ration card along with the original ration card (to be returned after verification) or a Residence Certificate from the Mamlatdar, the GFA stated in a press release.

The identity card issued by the Election Commission of India (election card) is compulsory. For players below the age of 18, identity card issued by the Election Commission of India (election card) of any of the parents/grandparents/ siblings is to be produced.
