Sonia Gandhi's 'poor thing' remark on Prez Murmu sparks controversy

Rashtrapati Bhavan says unfortunate and 'unacceptable'

PTI, NEW DELHI: Congress leader Sonia Gandhi's "poor thing and very tired" remarks about President Droupadi Murmu after the latter's hourlong address to Parliament on Friday snowballed into a huge controversy, with the Rashtrapati Bhavan saying they were in "poor taste, unfortunate and unacceptable."

Prime Minister Narendra Modi also tore into the Congress, accusing its 'shahi parivaar'(royal family) of insulting the President, who hails from a tribal background, and claiming that the party has always undermined the progress of those who come from marginalized communities.

The Rashtrapati Bhavan came out with a statement to say the remarks clearly hurt the dignity of the high office.

Soon after the President concluded her customary address to a joint sitting of Parliament to mark the start of the Budget session, Sonia Gandhi, Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi and Congress MP Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, also a party general secretary, were seen discussing the speech in the Parliament complex.

"The poor lady, the President, was getting very tired by the end... she could hardly speak, poor thing," Sonia Gandhi was heard saying in a video doing the rounds on social media.

During the discussion, Rahul Gandhi was also heard asking his mother if the President's speech was "boring".

When asked to comment on Sonia's comments, Priyanka Gandhi said her mother has the utmost respect for the President and that it is very unfortunate her remarks have been allegedly "twisted by the media".

She also hit out at the BIP's demand for an apology over the issue, saying it should first apologise for "ruining the country".

Cong slams Prez Murmu's speech as political

PTI. NEW DELHI: The Congress on Friday described President Droupadi Murmu's address to both Houses of Parliament as a "clear-cut political speech" and claimed that it had no acknowledgment of what an ordinary citizen of the country is experiencing day after day.

In her address, Murmu said the government has worked with a strong determination to lift the economy out of a state of "policy paralysis", despite global concerns, such as the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic and war-related uncertainties.

Addressing a joint sitting of Parliament, signalling the start of the Budget session, Murmu said the BJPled government's third term is seeing work being done at thrice the speed of previous administrations, citing decisions on issues such as Waqf boards and "One Nation, One Election".

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said it is very sad that the Narendra Modi government is making the president read the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) pamphlet.

"In this 10-year laundry list, the Modi government has exaggerated even the smallest schemes as if they have achieved a big feat. This has been recurringly seen in the President's address in past years also," Kharge said.

Delhi polls: Over 900 cases of violation of MCC registered

PTI, NEW DELHI: More than 900 cases of alleged violations of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) have been registered ahead of the February 5 Delhi Assembly polls, an official said.

The cases were lodged between January 7, when the MCC came into force, and January 30. A total of 29,172 people

have been arrested during this period under various legal provisions, including those under the Excise Act, according to a statement. Ahead of the polls, the

police have intensified vigilance at border checkpoints and conducted crackdowns on illegal activities, including the smuggling of arms, liquor and drugs.

Delhi Police has recorded 916 cases of alleged MCC violations and confiscated 426 illegal firearms and 487 cartridges with 439 people The police have also seized 99,285 litres of liquor and arrested 1,194 people, 166.993 kg of drugs worth over Rs 75.4 crore with more than 1,200 banned injections and arrested 162 people

7 AAP MLAs quit party days ahead of Delhi polls

PTI, NEW DELHI: In a setback to the AAP, seven of its outgoing MLAs resigned from the party on Friday, with only five days to go for the Delhi Assembly polls.

Sources said these MLAs were disgruntled after being denied tickets for the February 5 polls and were in touch with other parties.

Most of the MLAs shared their resignation letters on social media and slammed the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) over corruption and other is-

Madan Lal, the outgoing MLA from Kasturba Nagar, said seven AAP legislators, including him, have quit the party's primary membership.

He said they have also sent their resignation letters to Assembly Speaker Ram Niwas Goel. Besides Lal, the AAP

are Bhavna Gaur (Palam). Naresh Yadav (Mehrauli), Rohit Mehraulia (Trilok-Pawan Sharma puri), (Adarsh Nagar), B S Joon (Bijwasan) and Rajesh Rishi (Janakpuri).

"The seven MLAs were anguished over being given a cold shoulder by the party and its leaders, despite working honestly for years. We will soon share our future strategy," Lal told PTI

In her resignation letter addressed to party supremo Arvind Kejriwal, Gaur said, "I hereby resign from the primary membership of the Aam Aadmi Party as I have lost faith in you and the party." She is a two-time MLA from Palam.

Slamming these MLAs, AAP's national spokesperson Reena Gupta said a survey conducted by the party had revealed that all of them were unavailable to the public in their respective constituencies and that is why they were denied poll tickets.

"We did not give them tickets because of the unfavourable results of the survey. The fact that they are now attending another party after being refused tickets is not a huge deal. It is a part of politics," Gupta said.

Later, the AAP said in a statement that some MLAs were denied tickets for the February 5 polls, leading to "dissatisfaction". Over the last few weeks, under Kejriwal's leadership, the party has given poll tickets to ordinary individuals from humble backgrounds, the statement said.

The AAP has replaced 16 of its incumbent MLAs with new faces for the February 5 polls.

woman from Siddipet district in Telangana has diagnosed with been Guillain-Barré Syndrome (GBS), a rare nerve disorder, that is currently prevalent in some parts of Pune and surrounding areas, making it the first known case in the state.

According to a statement issued by KIMS Hospital here on Friday, the patient has no travel history to Pune. "A 25-year-old woman

from Siddipet, Telangana, is currently admitted and is put on a ventilator support treatment at KIMS Hospital after being diagnosed with GBS," it said.

According to Consultant Neurologist Dr Praveen Kumar Yada, "Despite the high prevalence of this disease in Pune, Maharashtra, the patient has no history of travel to Pune, nor does anyone in her family have a

CHHATTISGARH REPORTS FIRST CASE OF HMPV: 3-YEAR-OLD BOY TESTS POSITIVE

PTI, BILASPUR: A three-year-old boy admitted to a hospital in Chhattisgarh's Bilaspur city has been diagnosed with the human metapneumovirus (HMPV), marking the state's first such infection, health officials said on Friday. The boy, who hails from the neighbouring Korba district, was admitted to a private hospital here for a cold and cough on January 27, Chief Medical and Health Officer of Bilaspur Dr Pramod Tiwari said. Suspecting it to be a case of HMPV, his swab samples were sent to the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Raipur for examination, he said. After tests confirmed HMPV infection, the child was moved to an ICU, separated from other patients, in the hospital, he said. However, the child has shown no signs of improvement since admission, and we are considering shifting him to AIIMS
