This was East Bengal FC's 100th match in the ISL and they have now moved to 10th spot on the table standings with 18 points from as many games as a consequence of this result.

The Islanders, on the other hand, played their seventh draw of the season and are positioned sixth with 28 points from 18 matches, as they were unable to find a breakthrough despite holding 62.4 per cent of the possession in this match.

East Bengal FC picked up pace earlier on in this encounter, as their entire frontline functioned in tandem to slice open the Mumbai City FC defence in the 14th minute. Dimitrios Diamantakos drew bodies towards him down the cen-

tre, before he sensed space in front of Naorem Mahesh Singh on the left flank and laid a pass for him. Mahesh showed some quick footwork before launching in a low cross for Nandhakumar Sekar on the far post. Nandhakumar took a good first touch but his shot from an acute angle was thwarted by Phurba Lachenpa on the bottom right corner.

Mumbai City FC will play their next match against NorthEast United FC on February 7 in Shillong, as ISL is set to debut there. East Bengal FC are slated to return to action in front of Chennaiyin FC on February 8.

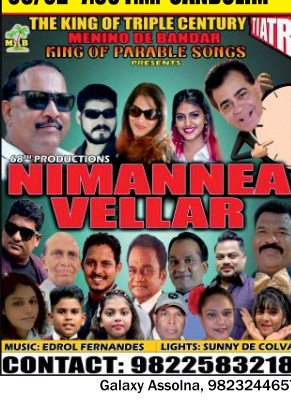

**Only one specialist spinner in Pakistan's 15-member squad for Champions Trophy**

**LAHORE:** Pakistan selectors on Friday sprung a surprise by including just one specialist spinner and picking nine batsmen in their 15-member squad for the Champions Trophy beginning next month. Ahrar Ahmed, 26, the only specialist spinner in the squad captained by Mohammad Rizwan, has played four ODIs taking 10 wickets with a best of 4/33. The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) said that it can make changes to the squad until February 11 as per the International Cricket Council's (ICC) rules. The selectors have recalled all-rounders Khushdil Shah and Faheem Ashraf and opener Fakhar Zaman, whose inclusion was on the cards after Saim Ayub sustained an ankle injury. The squad will also play a Tri-series with South Africa and New Zealand in Karachi and Lahore from February 8-14.
