LAKHS LOST IN BHATLEM GAS PIPELINE DAMAGE

Smart City blunder disrupts life across homes and commercial establishments

PANJIM: The gas pipeline that was allegedly damaged due to Smart City work in Bhatlem on Sunday led to an estimated loss of over Rs 20 lakh for the gas service provider, apart from disrupting services at homes and in commercial establishments for several hours.

Rahul Dubey, manager of operations at Goa Natural Gas Pvt Ltd, spoke to O Heraldo about the impact of the incident. "The financial loss exceeds Rs 20 lakh. However, the bigger issue was the damage to our credibility in the market. The gas supply was disrupted for around three hours, and it took over

PANJIM: The National Green Tribunal (NGT), Western Zone Bench, Pune, has issued notices to the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Change Climate (MoEF&CC), Vedanta Limited, and two other parties in response to an appeal filed by environmentalist Ramesh Gauns. Gauns is seeking to quash the Envi-

ronmental Clearance (EC) granted to Vedanta Ltd for the mining of iron ore at the Bicholim Mineral Block-(auction block) in North Goa.

The MoEF&CC, Vedanta Ltd, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), and the Goa State Pollution Control Board (GSPCB) have all been asked to file their responses within the next four weeks. The EC,

SC dismisses Vedanta's appeal against mining lease auction

PANJIM: The Supreme Court on Monday dismissed an appeal by Vedanta Ltd seeking to halt the Goa government's e-auction for the iron ore mining lease at the Curpem and Sulcorna Mineral Block-XI in Sanguem and Quepem Talukas, South Goa.

Vedanta Ltd had sought to be declared the preferred bidder, claiming it was the highest bidder in the November 14 auction and had received the subsequent letter of intent for the mining block. However, a bench of the Supreme Court, led by Justice Abhay S Oka, upheld the February 4 decision of the Bombay High Court at Goa, which had allowed further bidding for the lease.

Arambol shack licensee gets HC reprieve

Govt asked to hear licensee before razing shack

PANJIM: The High Court of Bombay at Goa on Monday directed the Department of Tourism to give a hearing to the licence holder of the controversial Arambol shack before demolition.

The licence holder Manuel Esprito Santo Fernandes by a writ petition had challenged the demolition order of the Department of Tourism, in the High Court.

By an order dated January 29, 2025, the Department of Tourism had ordered demolition of the shack following a murder of a local allegedly by the staff of the concerned shack on January 26.

During investigation, it was found that the shack was alleg-

edly sub-let by the original shack licence holder to an outsider. The Department had also imposed a penalty of Rs 25 lakh for subletting it to another person, in violation of Clause 20 of the Tourism Shack Policy. The department had also forfeited his security deposit.

The department had further asked Fernandes to demolish the shack within a period of seven days failing which, it will carry out the demolition at the cost and risk of the allottee, with expenses recovered as arrears of land revenue.

Fernandes blackpermanently listed and debarred participating in any future shack allotment processes under the Tourism Shack Policy.
