GOA'S RECENT HISTORY OF CBI INVESTIGATIONS

Goa has witnessed similar high-profile cases being transferred

to the CBI in the past, largely due to public outrage and judicial intervention. The infamous Scarlett Keeling death case, the police-politician-drug mafia nexus involving Israeli drug lords Atala and Dudu, and other politically sensitive cases were all handed over to the central agency only after sustained pressure. Given this precedent, legal experts and activists argue that the Siddiqui case fits the pattern of an investigation that demands independent scrutiny.

"If the state police themselves are under the scanner, how can they be expected to conduct a fair investigation?" asked a senior Police Officer on the condition of anonymity, adding that "denying a CBI probe in this case only strengthens suspicions of a cover-up."

CALL FOR POLITICAL ACCOUNTABILITY

The role of one BJP MLA has also come under scrutiny, with opposition leaders demanding his immediate resignation to ensure a fair investigation. "If the MLA is named in this controversy and the police are accused of shielding those in power, then this is no longer just a law-and-order issue—it is a constitutional crisis," Kawthankar said.

THE FIRST ACCUSED **IN GOA TO DEMAND** A CBI PROBE

What makes this case unprecedented is that Siddiqui, an accused himself, is actively demanding a CBI probe, alleging that the police are plotting his murder. This has raised serious questions about whether law enforcement agencies in Goa are serving justice or working as enforcers for political and criminal interests.

'Fraud' forex trading scheme: ED seizes Rs 170 crore worth bank deposits

PTI. NEW DELHI: The Enforcement Directorate on Thursday said it has frozen bank deposits worth Rs 170 crore following recent searches against promoters of an alleged fraudulent forex trading and deposit

The federal agency said in a statement that raids were launched on February 11 at various premises in Delhi, Noida and Shamli in Uttar Pradesh and Rohtak in Haryana as part of a probe against QFX Trade Ltd. and its directors named Rajendra Sood. Vineet Kumar and Santosh Kumar apart from one of the "mastermind" Nawab Ali alias Lav-

ish Chaudhary. The money laundering probe stems from multiple FIRs filed by the Himachal Pradesh Police against QFX company.

Prez rule imposed in Manipur New Income Tax

PTI, NEW DELHI: President's rule was imposed in strife-torn Manipur on Thursday and the State Assembly put under suspended animation, days after Chief Minister N Biren Singh resigned from his post that led to political uncertainty in the north-

eastern State. The Manipur assembly, which has a tenure till 2027, has been put under suspended animation, according to a notification issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs.

Singh, who was heading the BJP government in Manipur, resigned as chief minister after nearly 21 months of ethnic violence that has claimed over 250

'TECH SUPPORT': Musk calls for US to 'delete entire agencies' from federal government

Tesla CEO says if roots of the weed are not removed, then it's easy for it to grow back

AP, DUBAI: Tech billionaire and Tesla CEO Elon Musk called on Thursday for the United States to "delete entire agencies" from the federal government as part of his push under President Donald Trump to radically cut spending and restructure its priorities. Musk offered a wide-ranging

survey via a video call to the World Governments Summit in Dubai, of what he described as the priorities of the Trump administration interspersed with multiple references to "thermonuclear warfare" and the possible dangers of artificial intelligence.

"We really have here the rule of the bureaucracy as opposed to the rule of the people — democracy," Musk said, wearing a black T-shirt that read: "Tech Support." He also joked that he was the "White House's tech support," borrowing from his profile on the social platform X, which he owns.

"I think we do need to delete entire agencies as opposed to leaving a lot of them behind." Musk said. "If we don't remove the roots of the weed, then it's easy for the weed to grow back."

While Musk has spoken to the summit in the past, his appearance on Thursday comes viting a constitutional clash

as he has consolidated control over large swaths of the government with Trump's blessing since assuming leadership of the Department of Government Efficiency.
