

"Sears felt some pain in his left hamstring at the team's first training in Karachi on Wednesday and a subsequent scan revealed a minor tear that would require at least two weeks' rehabilitation," NZC said.

Doping: Koki Ikeda banned for 4 years

Asia Mixed Team C'ship: India crash out

MONACO: Japanese race walker Koki Ikeda, a former Olympic silver medalist, has been banned for four years for doping, the Athletic Integrity Unit said Friday. The athletics watchdog said that a disciplinary and appeals tribunal ruled that the 26-yearold Ikeda had broken anti-doping rules. Ikeda has been provisionally banned from competition since November 2024, with his results disqualified since June 2023.

QINGDAO (China): HS Prannoy fought valiantly, but India

succumbed to a 0-3 defeat against a second-string Japan in the guarter-finals of the Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championships, ending their campaign on a disappointing note, here, on Friday.
