rhinoceroses. The park offers a thrilling wildlife experience, where visitors can enjoy jeep safaris or even go on elephant-back rides through the grasslands.

The state's Bihu festival, celebrated in April, is a celebration of Assam's agricultural heritage, and it's an excellent way to experience the local culture. With its dances, songs, and vibrant festivities, Bihu brings Assam's rich traditions to life. Whether you're hiking in the Nameri National Park, or cruising along the mighty Brahmaputra River, Assam's blend of nature, culture, and history makes it an essential stop in the Northeast.

MEGHALAYA: THE ABODE OF CLOUDS

Often referred to as the 'Abode of Clouds', Meghalaya's landscape is as ethereal as its name suggests. This state is often called one of the most picturesque in India. Meghalaya is home to the famous Cherrapunji (Sohra),



once the wettest place on Earth, and the stunning Nohkalikai Falls, one of the highest waterfalls in India. The state's unique living root bridges, especially in Mawlynnong—often dubbed the cleanest village in Asia—are a must-see. These bridges are made from the roots of rubber trees, grown and shaped by the Khasi tribe over generations.

For adventure seekers, Meghalaya's Sohra and Mawlynnong caves offer thrilling exploration opportunities, while its numerous trekking trails provide stunning views of the surrounding forests. If you visit in the winter, don't miss the Meghalaya Winter Festival, which showcases the rich cultural diversity of the state.

NAGALAND: THE LAND OF FESTIVALS AND TRIBES

Nagaland, one of the most culturally distinct states in India, offers a deep dive into the tribal traditions that have shaped its identity. With more than 16 major tribes, each with its own customs, language, and art, Nagaland provides a fascinating

cultural experience. The Hornbill Festival, held every December, is Nagaland's most famous event. It's the perfect opportunity to connect with Nagaland's indigenous cultures and learn about their unique ways of life.

Kohima, the state capital, is an excellent base for exploring the surrounding villages and hills. For those interested in history, the Kohima War Cemetery offers a glimpse into the region's role in World War II.

Battle of Imphal during World War II shapes much of Manipur's recent history. The Kangla Fort is a testament to Manipur's regal past, offering a glimpse into its rich heritage.

TRIPURA: THE HIDDEN GEM OF THE NORTHEAST

Known for its historical ruins, beautiful temples, and lush greenery, Tripura is one of the least explored states in the Northeast, making it a hidden gem for adventurous travellers. The Ujjayanta Palace, once the royal residence, is an architectural marvel and now serves as a museum, giving visitors a glimpse into the state's royal past. The Neermahal Palace, located on the banks of Lake Rudrasagar, is another must-see, offering a unique blend of Hindu and Mughal architecture.

For nature lovers, Sepahijala Wildlife Sanctuary offers a chance to witness wildlife and enjoy boat rides through the scenic wetlands. The state is also known for its festivals, particularly the Kharchi Puja, which honours the local deities and is marked by vibrant processions and celebrations.

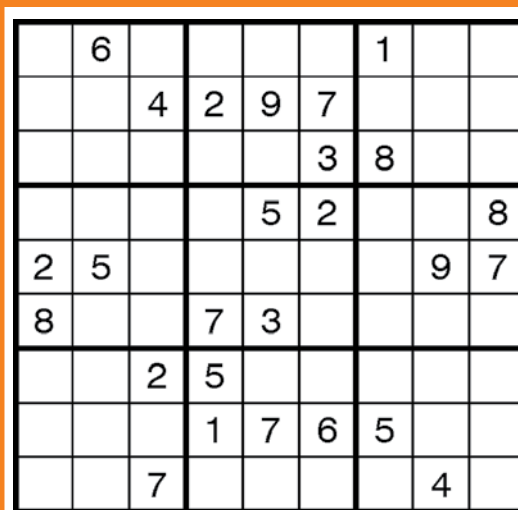
