Women's Premier League: Lanning, Sutherland hand Delhi Capitals 7-wkt win

VADODARA: Skipper Meg Lanning struck 69 off 49 balls as Delhi Capitals produced a solid batting effort to beat UP Warriorz by seven wickets and register their second win in the Women's Premier League, here, on Wednesday. Sent into bat, UP Warriorz rode on opener Kiran Navgire's quick-fire half-century to post 166 for seven. But the total was not enough as besides Lanning, Annabel Sutherland played a crucial 35-ball 41-run knock and was ably supported by Marizanne Kapp (19 not off 17) and opener Shafali Verma (16 off 16). Delhi completed the chase with a ball to spare. DC were off to a brisk start with Shafali and Lanning sharing 65 runs in just 41 balls for the opening stand. Shafali was going great guns before she was caught by Chinelle Henry off Deepti Sharma in the seventh over. Earlier, sent into bat, Navgire (51 off 27 balls) and Dinesh Vrinda (16 off 15) shared 66 runs in 5.5 overs to give a great start to UP Warriorz innings. Thereafter, UP Warriorz lost five wickets for 52 runs. Sheweta Sehrawat (37 off 33) and Grace Harris (12) added 36 runs for the fifth wicket before the latter spooned a straightforward catch to Shafali Verma at mid-off off the bowling of pacer Arundhati Reddy. Towards the end, Chinelle Henry (33 not out off 15) played a brief little cameo to take UP Warriorz past 160. For DC, Annabel Sutherland was the pick of the bowlers with figures of 2/26 from her four overs.

Gill dethrones Azam to become No. 1 batter in ICC ODI rankings

DUBAI: India Vice-Captain Shubman Gill on Wednesday dethroned Babar Azam of Pakistan from the No. 1 spot in the ICC ODI Rankings for batters on the back of his strong show against England in the recent home series. The ICC issued the latest rankings just ahead of the start of the eight-team Champions Trophy in Karachi with the match between Pakistan and New Zealand. "India right-hander Shubman Gill overtakes former Pakistan captain Babar Azam to become the top ranked ODI batter in the world," the ICC said. He now has 796 rating points compared to Babar's 773. India skipper Rohit Sharma is placed at the third spot with 761 points followed by South Africa's Henrich Klaasen and New Zealand's Daryl Mitchell at fourth and fifth respectively. Sri Lanka's Maheesh Theekshana, meanwhile, has taken the first position in the ODI rankings for bowlers as he replaced Afghanistan captain Rashid Khan. The Sri Lankan spinner has 680 rating points, followed by Rashid at second, Namibia's Bernard Scholtz at third, India's Kuldeep Yadav at fourth and Pakistan's Shaheen Shah Afridi at fifth. Afghanistan veteran Mohammad Nabi remains the top ranked all-rounder in ODIs, followed by Sikandar Raza, Azmatullah Omarzai, Mehidy Hasan Miraz and Rashid.

India men beat Germany 1-0 in FIH Pro League return match

Spain earned as many as nine penalty corners in the match while India got just two. This was India's second consecutive loss to Spain as the hosts had lost 3-4 in the first leg here on Tuesday.

Diokovic loses to Berrettini in Doha. says no pain in hamstring

DOHA: Novak Djokovic was upset by Matteo Berrettini 7-6 (4), 6-2 on Tuesday at the Qatar Open in the Serb's first match since exiting the Australian Open with a hamstring injury. The 37-year-old Djokovic, ranked No. 7, lost to the Italian for the first time in five career matches and will have to wait to join Jimmy Connors (109) and Roger Federer (103) as the only players in the ATP Tour's 100-win club. The 24-time Grand Slam champion reached the Australian Open semi-finals but retired from the last-four match against Alexander Zverev because of a hamstring injury. Djokovic said he didn't have "any pain or discomfort." "I was outplayed by just a better player today," he said. Also on Tuesday, No. 2 seed Alex de Minaur defeated Roman Safiullin 6-1, 7-5. Meanwhile, Andy Murray looks set to remain as Novak Djokovic's coach likely through the French Open. The 24-time Grand Slam champion told the media channel that Murray has agreed to stay on as coach.

Raducanu loses to Muchova after a spectator is ejected in Dubai

DUBAI: Emma Raducanu lost to Karolina Muchova after an emotional first set in which a spectator was ejected at the Dubai Championships. The 2021 US. Open champion appeared to be in tears as she went to the umpire's chair after the second game on Tuesday and her second-round match was briefly paused on Court 2. The British player rallied from 4-0 down to force a tiebreaker but eventually lost 7-6 (6), 6-4 to Muchova. The 14th-seeded Muchova advanced to a meeting against No. 53-ranked McCartney Kessler, who upset 2023 U.S. Open champion Coco Gauff 6-4, 7-5. Third-ranked Gauff hadn't fallen to an opponent ranked outside the top 50 since a loss to Sofia Kenin (128th) at Wimbledon in 2023. Earlier, second-seeded Iga Swiatek beat Victoria Azarenka 6-0, 6-2 and will next face Dayana Yastremska for a spot into the quarter-finals. Top-seeded Aryna Sabalenka eliminated Veronia Kudermetova 6-3, 6-4, and defending champion Jasmine Paolini defeated Eva Lys 6-2, 7-5. Elena Rybakina, Jessica Pegula and Paula Badosa also advanced.

Neymar is among the players protesting the use of artificial turf pitches in Brazil

SAO PAULO: Neymar, Memphis Depay and Thiago Silva are among the leading Brazilian footballers protesting against using artificial turf for league matches instead of natural grass. They all campaigned online with the same message Tuesday highlighting their fear of increased injury risk for players on the artificial surfaces. Some clubs in Brazil's top divisions are using artificial turf to allow for multiple uses for stadiums while minimizing damage to the playing surfaces. "It is worrying to see the direction Brazilian football is taking. With the size and representation of our sport, this debate shouldn't even exist. In the most respected leagues in the world, players are heard and investments are made to ensure the quality of the pitch in the stadiums," the footballers said in a statement. "The solution to a bad pitch is to make a good pitch, it is as simple as that. Soccer is natural, not artificial."
