## FDA CRACKS DOWN ON SUBSTANDARD **CASHEW SALES IN CALANGUTE, BAGA**

CALANGUTE: The Food and Drugs Administration (FDA) conducted raids on three shops—Balaji Kaju, P Patel Kaju, and Goa Kaju House—for violating quality norms. Officials found vendors misleading customers by packaging premium cashews visibly on the outer side while conceal-ing inferior ones inside. Additionally, they were caught selling underweight packets by tampering with weighing scales and packaging stale nuts. Legal cases have been filed against all three vendors. Raids are conducted every fortnight to uphold product quality. "Cashew nuts are a symbol of Goa, and we want tourists to get the best guality," FDA officials stated.

# MAN BOOKED FOR ASSAULTING WOMAN AND SON OVER PROPERTY DISPUTE

MARGAO: Preeti Estiberio of Macazana, Salcete, has lodged a complaint with Maina-Curtorim Police, alleging that she and her son were allegedly assaulted and threatened by Anthony Basildes D'Costa, alias Tony, over a property dispute. The incident occurred on February 20, around 8.15 pm, near Algeria Dance Floor, Maina-Raia, where the accused allegedly blocked her vehicle, smashed a car window, and attacked her and her son, Arvind Victor Estiberio, with a hard object, causing injuries. The accused also verbally abused, threatened, and made indecent gestures towards Estiberio. Police have registered an offence under multiple sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), and an investigation is underway.

# CALANGUTE DEPUTY SARPANCH **OUSTED IN NO-CONFIDENCE VOTE**

**CALANGUTE**: Geeta Parab, Deputy Sarpanch of the Calangute Panchayat, was voted out in a no-confidence motion on Thursday after eight out of 11 panchayat members backed the move. Calangute Sarpanch Joseph Sequeira, who had filed the no-confidence motion on February 12, stated that there was an understanding that Parab that she would step down after two and a half years. However, as she refused to resign, he initiated the motion, leading to her removal. Parab, a former sarpanch, denied the existence of such an agreement, stating that the noconfidence motion came as an unexpected surprise.

### PUNE BUSINESSMAN ACCUSED OF CHEATING IN PET FOOD SCAM

MARGAO: Akhsay Vaidya from Bavdhan, Pune, has been booked for fraud after allegedly inducing a complainant into a pet food business under Pure Bite Pvt Ltd and supplying contaminated products. The complainant suffered financial losses of Rs 1.7 lakh while Vaidya allegedly mis-used two blank cheques worth Rs 4,44,846 each. He later filed a cheque dishonour case under Section 138 of the NI Act against the complainant.

### **RICKSHAW DRIVER BOOKED FOR** NEGLIGENCE IN MARGAO CRASH



Alcoholism linked to rising social and health issues: **Alcoholics Anonymous**

PANJIM: Alcoholism is a major contributing factor to one-third of suicides, two-thirds of domestic violence cases, 40% of job absenteeism, and over 200 medical conditions, according to Alcoholics Anonymous (AA).

Speaking at the Global Convention in Goa, the organisation emphasised the need to challenge the false narrative of modernity associated with alcohol consumption.

Dr Ashish Deshpande, Trustee at Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), highlighted a growing trend of alcohol consumption among women in corporate settings. "As the age of first exposure decreases, the likelihood of social damage due to addictive substances increases by up to five times, especially if consumption begins before the age of 15," he stated. Dr Deshpande warned that un-

awareness of alcohol's dangers is allowing modern lifestyle influences-films, advertisements, and social trends-to normalise drinking. "Young minds receive the message that alcohol is harmless, making them more curious and open to experimenting with it," he said.

To counteract this, he stressed the urgent need for awareness campaigns. "Real-world information about alcohol-related diseases must be published and broadcast in the media to provide a counter-narrative," he urged. "If no alternative viewpoint exists, society becomes increasingly permissive, and as alcohol consumption rises, 3% to 8% of individuals will face social consequences linked to drinking."

"We must unite our voices and actively challenge this so-called 'modernity' associated with alcohol," he concluded.

# Site inspection of mining affected areas conducted **Team Herald**

BICHOLIM: Bicholim Deputy Collector and Sub-Divisional Officer Bhimnath Khorjuvekar on Friday carried out a site inspection of mining affected areas in Mulgao village and directed the mining company to take preventive measures within a fortnight.

Mulgao sarpanch Mansi Kauthankar, panchayat members, Mulgao Nagrik Kruti Samiti president Vasant Gad, Comunidade of Mulgao president Maheshwar Parab, villagers and representatives of mining company were present.

Recalling the landslide reported at Mulgao in July 2011, the villagers expressed their apprehensions and urged the authorities to take immediate corrective measures and to ensure that no untoward incident happen. The Mulgao village is recorded as landslide prone area. The villagers also demanded that the transportation of iron ore be not allowed in Mulgao.
