6 members of banned outfit arrested in Manipur, two others held for extortion

PTI, IMPHAL: Six cadres of a banned outfit were arrested from Manipur's Imphal West district, and two members of a group were apprehended for allegedly being involved in extortion in Imphal East, police said on Saturday.

Six members of the proscribed Kangleipak Communist Party (Ibungo Ngangom) were apprehended from Koutruk Makha Leikai Church in Imphal West on Friday, a senior officer said.

The police also arrested two members of G5 Organisation from Achanbigei Maning Leikai in Imphal East district for allegedly being involved in extortion from sand-laden trucks in Sekmai, Iriblung, Koirengai and Patsoi areas.

They were also allegedly involved in incidents of snatching keys from truck drivers in Sekmai area.

They have been identified as Ningthoujam Yamba Singh (43) and Usham Nejai Singh (35), the officer added.

"This is the first step towards de-weaponising the society and creating a safe and secure atmosphere where regular activities can be boosted," Churachandpur SP Prakar Pandey said in a statement.

MEITEI ORGANISATION CALLS FOR EXTENDED TIMEFRAME TO SURRENDER ILLEGAL WEAPONS IN MANIPUR

PTI, IMPHAL: In response to Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla's appeal to the people of the strife-torn state to voluntarily surrender looted and illegally held weapons within seven days, an umbrella body of Imphal-based civil society organisations of the Meiteis on Saturday requested him to "engage formally with local youth leaders to ensure a cooperative approach in recovering arms from civilian volunteers". In a statement, the Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCOMI) also said that the "seven-day timeframe is too short for meaningful engagement with the stakeholders and the public." Bhalla had on February 20 urged the people of the state to surrender weapons within seven days, assuring no punitive action would be initiated against those giving up arms during this period. He, however, had asserted that "strict action" would be taken after the expiry of the deadline.

8 workers trapped as portion of tunnel collapses in Telangana, rescue ops in full swing

PTI, HYDERABAD: Eight persons were trapped in a tunnel after a section of it collapsed in the Srisailem Left Bank Canal (SLBC) project on Saturday and rescue operations were on in full swing to the extricate them, the state government said.

Telangana Irrigation Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy told reporters at the accident site in Nagarkurnool district, about 150 km from here, that the state government is taking the help of experts, including those who rescued trapped workers in a similar incident in Uttarakhhand last year, and also that of the Indian Army and NDRF.

Two of the trapped are engineers of an infra firm and two are operators, employed with a US company. Four others are labourers. Thy all belong to Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhad, Punjab and Jammu and Kashmir. Fresh air was being

pumped into the tunnel to ensure the safety of those trapped, sources said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi called up Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy to inquire about the incident and assured all possible assistance from the Centre for the ongoing rescue operation.

Teams of NDRF and SDRF have reached the spot and a team of army personnel is on its way, a senior police official told PTI.

After the construction work resumed recently, as many as 50 persons went inside the tunnel in the first shift along with the tunnel boring machine which is 200 meter long, on Saturday morning.

UP: Mosque demolished to make way for RRTS Corridor

PTI, MEERUT: A decades-old mosque located on Delhi Road in Meerut was demolished to make way for the construction of the Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) Corridor.

The demolition was carried out with the consent of the local Muslim community after consultations with officials and the mosque's management, officials said.

According to authorities, the mosque was causing obstruction in the progress of the Rapid Rail project, prompting the decision to remove it.

The process began with members of the Muslim community using hammers to dismantle parts of the mosque on Thursday. Later, when most of the structure had been taken down, the administration used a bulldozer to complete the demolition.

Security forces bust Maoist dump in Chhattisgarh; seize weapons, explosive materials

PTI, SUKMA: Security forces unearthed a Maoist dump in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district and recovered weapons and explosive materials on Saturday morning, police said.

A joint team of security forces made the seizure from the forest of the Chintavagu River near Gundrajgudem village under Chintavagu police station limits, an official said.

Acting on inputs about the presence of Naxalites, personnel from the 131st battalion of the Central

Amid opposition, govt to revise draft bill to amend Advocates Act

PTI, NEW DELHI: Amid opposition to its various provisions from bar bodies, the government on Saturday said it will revise the draft Advocates (Amendment) Bill as it ended the public consultations on it that started earlier this month.

The Department of Legal Affairs in the Union law ministry floated the draft bill on February 13 for public consultations.

The opposition Congress had also backed the protesting lawyers, saying the bill was not only "poorly drafted", but it also failed to address pertinent issues facing the legal fraternity.

The draft bill defines a legal practitioner as an advocate or a law graduate engaged in the practice of law before courts, tribunals or quasi-judicial forums or doing legal work in any private or public organisation, including but not limited to statutory and autonomous bodies, domestic and foreign law firms and corporate entities.

As of now, a legal practitioner means an advocate or a "vakil" of any high court, a pleader, a "mukhtar" or revenue agent.

While putting the draft bill in the public domain, the ministry had said these amendments aimed at aligning the legal profession and legal education with global best practices.

The Class 10 student's father, who had been battling an illness, passed away on Thursday evening. His funeral was scheduled at their Bhada village for Friday.

Disha, a student of Zilla Parishad Girls' School in

Bhada, said she was unsure if she would appear for her Secondary School Certificate (SSC) paper on Friday. That's when her teacher Shivaling Nagapure stepped in.

Nagapure said he reached out to Sudhakar Telang, chairman of the Latur Divisional Board, who spoke with Disha and encouraged her not to give up. Showing immense cour-

age, the 16-year-old girl wiped off her tears, bid farewell to her father and headed to the exam centre at Azim High School in Ausa on Friday for her Marathi paper. Disha's family includes her grandmother, mother, and younger brother.

While she wrote her paper in Ausa, her father's last rites were performed, said Premnath Lature, a resident of Bhada village.
