

# Mohun Bagan SG become first team to defend ISL title

PTI, KOLKATA: Mohun Bagan Super Giant on Sunday became the first team in Indian Super League (ISL) history to defend the title with a 1-0 win over Odisha FC here.

**ISL** By virtue of clinching the ISL Shield, MBSG also booked a berth in the AFC Champions League 2, the continent's second tier club competition.

After the win in their 22nd league game, Mohun Bagan Super Giant secured 52 points and emerged Shield Winners with two matches to spare.

Their nearest rivals, FC Goa, have collected 42 points from 21 matches, and they cannot catch MBSG even if they win

**PANJIM:** Bishworjit Saikhom of the Indian Army and the miniOrange Sports Academy team won the Goa Triathlon clocking an impressive 2:08:53 hours for the 51.5km distance.

The Olympic distance, Goa Triathlon was making a comeback in this year's miniOrange AquaMoga 2025 event after a hiatus of seven years.

Bishworjit, winner of the 2024 Ironman 70.3 Goa race was a favourite from start to finish. He was out of the sea first and led the swim-bike-run segments from start to the finish. Bishworjit was followed closely by teammate Bitten Laikhuram in a time of

2:10:10 hours and Nihal Baig of Pune, a former, Ironman 70.3 Goa champion in third position with a time of 2:21:42 hrs.

Riddhi Kadam, another Team miniOrange triathlete was the quickest woman triathlete winning her race with a time of 2:31:19 hours. Her miniOrange team-mate, Sweety Nongmaithem was likewise

the quickest female athlete in the newly introduced, Aquathlon event winning her 1.5km swim plus 10km run event in 1:44:30 hours, on a day dominated by the Pune-based miniOrange Sports Academy.

The two other events which saw some fast racing were the Olympic distance triathlons in the women's and men's junior

Kabadash Singh of Team miniOrange won the men's category in 2:13:15 hours, followed closely by Mohammed Roshan in 2:18:54 hours, while, Keerthi Sakthivel (2:36:05 hours) and S HariPriya (2:41:49 hours) also from Team miniOrange grabbed the top two positions in the junior women's category.

## GBA conducts WABC Level 1 certification programme

**PANJIM:** The Basketball Federation of India under the aegis of FIBA-ASIA has successfully completed the WABC Level 1 (World Association of Basketball Coaches) Certification Programme in the State hosted by the Goa Basketball Association.

This is the second such programme conducted in Goa, the last begin conducted in 2017 by FIBA Instructor Nelson Isley. Fifteen coaches from across India were carefully selected to undertake the certification, which now will be the criteria for all coaches (State/National/International) to be able to assume the role as coaches.

Goa, as host was able to get five local coaches selected by the FIBA based on their criteria after application. The five Goa coaches are - Lambert Godinho,

Andriel Fernandes, Flobert Monteiro, Dillano Marchon and Vassily Mascarenhas.

The certification programme of six days was conducted by FIBA Instructor Arnika Patil, the first FIBA instructor of India, with prominent members of the Indian Basketball fraternity who were part of the programme such as Geethu Anna Rahul - an Arjuna Awardee; Anitha Pauldurai
