



A Return to Art

After a successful career in advertising, Philip D'Souza returns to his first and enduring love of art with his debut solo show Safari in Goa

With 'Safari', Philip D'Souza's first showing of paintings, drawings and digital works, the artist travels back in time, taking viewers through a "literal journey of discovery, one that has taken me from my roots back in Africa, through my susegad years in Goa, on through heady days in national advertising all around India, with photography, video production and design consulting," says Philip.


Life often gets in the way of making art and after graduating from the Goa College of Art, with much discouragement from his teacher towards his artistic ambition, the young Philip turned to making his career in commercial advertising. Exciting years followed with Philip working on many notable and memorable ad campaigns, mingling with celebrities and top models and endless travel to exotic shoot locales. And despite all the glamour, sheen and success of the ad world, he was drawn back to what excited him the most as a child—drawing.

"Safari is my personal journey – of being introspective, self-critical, expressive. It has helped shape my thinking, my world view. Safari is also my creative journey – from years working as creative director on high profile advertising accounts to waking up one day

and realizing my true happiness lay in simply putting pen to paper, paint on canvas," says the artist, who devotes his time to his two true passions – art and fishing.

Urged and encouraged to exhibit his body of work by his old friend, fellow Goa College of Art alumnus and noted artist Yolanda De Sousa, Philip finally debuted his solo showing at the Art Chamber in Calangute this February. Featuring imagery drawn from his early years in Africa and his native Goa, striking visuals are displayed in unusual ways, strung with fishing line or hung from fishing rods. And while he embarks on his personal journey of discovery, Philip also explores larger thematic concerns. Goa becomes the muse in most of his figurative artworks, suffused by a touch of surrealism and fantasy.

He laments the loss of Goa's natural beauty and tranquil charm in more than one painting. Titled 'Amchem Noxib' (Our Luck) the series looks at the problems that beset Goa with a clear yet artistic eye. In 'Highway to Nowhere,' a ubiquitous coconut tree lined road seems to extend into a rosy future but ends abruptly. In 'The Wishing Well,'



beautiful women, inspired by the full figured women of Renaissance art, pose with a plough, a basket of fish or earthen pots, lulling viewers into a state of enchantment with the pretty scene before them, only for them to realize the well i.e Goa has run dry. Allegories of lust, sin, greed, easy money, gambling with Goa's future are drawn out in paintings including 'Rose Tinted Memories,' 'River of Dreams' and 'Stained.'

The 'Out of Africa' series pulls disparate elements together. Philip juxtaposes imagery from the wild world and the powerful presence of nature with the endless greed of the man made one. Says the reticent, articulate artist, "I wanted to

portray the brutality behind beauty."

In his series of small format digital works titled 'Carnaval!' the artist takes viewers on a bumpy ride around the gallery with both fantasy and humour, the works inspired by Danse Macabre or the dance with death allegory. While Philip's paintings and digital works reflect an alluring vitality, it is with his drawings, in pen and ink on paper, that the artist really comes into his own; sketching and shading scenes borne of his imagination, and executed in a style that is both hard hitting yet quietly poetic.

Stand before this array of diverse images that compel attention and look closely for nothing is as it seems; a skilful artist is responding to the times he finds himself in with intensity, moving beyond merely decorative banal beauty with a powerfully original first exhibition.

'Safari' is on view at Art Chamber, Calangute until the end of February.



An inimitable piece of art at Varca

The San Thome Museum Back in Time at Varca which opened in 2014 by curator Thomas Antonio da Costa is a unique museum of antiques that also highlights technical evolution over the years. Now, the curator himself has created a beautiful



portrait, a two-in-one art of the Father and Son at the museum.

Inspired by John 14:5-7, "Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?'" Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him". Thomas was able to create this unique portrait. "This is the first time in the world that piece has been created with a two-in-one sculpture of Father and Son. This piece of art is made of nuts and bolts, screws and rivets to make the sculpture resemble the Father and Son," says Thomas.

An electrical engineer by profession, Thomas started the project in 2022 and it was completed by 2023. "The piece is made out of nuts, bolts, screws, spring washers, plain washers, Allen bolts, needle nails, horseshoe magnets, tower bolts,

etc with approximately 2,155 metal items. These metal pieces bring together a lenticular artwork that offers two perspectives—one side resembling God and the other revealing a younger face of Jesus the Son," explains Thomas. After two years of waiting, Thomas

revealed his art at the perfect moment. It was finally unveiled on his father, Artur Da Costa's 100th birth anniversary and blessed by his brother, Fr Ligorinho Da Costa, Dean of Benaulim Deanery. Among the many items on display at the museum, this masterpiece now takes centre stage.



International Conference on Life Skills Education

First-Ever Baattachem Fest celebrated in Chinchinim

The village of Chinchinim came alive with the vibrant Baattachem Fest, a unique celebration of Goa's agricultural traditions and rich cultural heritage was curated by Festakar Marius Fernandes and hosted by Adv Agnelo Furtado. The festival began with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp by guests, including Agnelo and Elaine Furtado, Dean Suresh Kunkalkar, Miguel Braganza, Prakash Kamat, Fr Victor Ferrao, Alexyz and Marius.

Baattachem Fest welcomed attendees from across Goa, including Corlim, Panjim, Mapusa, Divar, Nuvem, Navelim and other parts of Goa, reinforcing its spirit of inclusivity. The festival was compered and coordinated by festakar team members, Prakash Kamat, Dr Gwendolyn de Ornelas and Dominic D'Souza. The stage was artistically decorated by Marcos D'Mello with natural farm tools and locally coordinated by Rozario Rebello.

One of the festival's most engaging features was the Balcaoaecho Gozalli, a platform where Miguel Braganza, Professor Carmelito Andrade, Jovito Lopes and Fr George Quadros shared their knowledge and experiences. Visitors were transported back in time with demonstrations of



traditional fishing net making, Goan bread preparation, and local delicacy cooking, offering a nostalgic glimpse into Goa's way of life. A spectacular Kottiaecho Nach (coconut shell dance), conceptualized by Dr Gwendolyn de Ornelas, captivated the audience, while live musical performances by Oluw and Zagor performance by Santos Rebello, Valentino Baretto and others filled the air with the melodies of classic Konkani songs, celebrating Goa's vibrant music heritage.

The festival was also a feast for



the senses, showcasing Goa's rich culinary and artisanal traditions. Attendees explored stunning displays of Goan bread, fresh produce, fruits, and traditional percussion instruments. Interactive workshops on local delicacies such as bread by local baker Elvina Lacerda and koyloreo by Leticia Furtado provided an immersive experience, fostering a sense of belonging and cultural pride.


