São José de Areal villagers urge halt to coal transport, railway station plans

MARGAO: Upset that the government is pressing ahead with the railway project in São José de Areal, villagers have voiced strong opposition to the proposed Konkan Railway station, yard, and goods shed in their agrarian village.

Residents have also called for an immediate halt to the transportation of coal by both road and rail. They further demanded the cessation of all ongoing coal-related projects in São José de Areal and across Goa.

On Wednesday, the villagers made a heartfelt appeal to South Goa MP Captain Viriato Fernandes and handed over a memorandum outlining several concerns affecting both their village and the State.

The MP assured the villagers that he would raise the issue with the Chairman and Managing Director of the Konkan Railway Cor-



India's first heritage stitched ship launched on Divar island

The vessel will dock at Karwar port, from where a Navy Captain will mentor the crew on subsequent voyages

MARGAO: In a step towards reviving India's maritime heritage, the country's first ancient stitched ship was officially launched at the Hodi Innovation shipyard on Divar Island. The event, held on Wednesday, was attended by senior Indian Navy officials, including Rear Admiral KM Ramakrishnan, VSM, Flag Officer Commanding Karnataka Naval Area (FOK), who was the chief guest.

Designed and built entirely in Goa, the ship is a tribute to India's traditional shipbuilding techniques. The vessel has been crafted using coconut fibre stitching, traditional wooden joinery, and natural resins, methods historically used in ancient Indian maritime construction. The project brought together expert artisans from across India, including a skilled team led by master craftsman Babu Shankaran from Kerala.

Speaking at the launch, Prathamesh Dandekar, Managing Director of Hodi Innovations, described the ship as a "living testament to India's shipbuilding legacy." He credited the artisans for their dedication and expressed gratitude to the Indian Navy and the Ministry of Culture for their support in bringing

We were affected by the disruption of internet services. However, those with Jio wireless connectivity had no issues, which helped to some extent. On the other hand, people using wired services faced significant problems. Many switched to Jio wireless as an alternative. The disruption impacted a lot of people, especially students-it's not as if it went unnoticed. Even business owners were affected

I believe the cable operators are at fault. The electricity department had previously issued them a warning, yet they neither heeded it nor made the necessary payments. If they were required to pay the government, they should have done so. Now, we are operating from St. Cruz using BSNL, and we haven't faced any issues. The Executive Engineer (EE) who was recently removed had stated that only cables in Panjim were cut. But if that's the case, how did internet services across Goa go down? Everyone was complaining. How did this happen? I strongly feel that the cable operators themselves deliberately disrupted services. The electricity department is not to blame for this situation
