Former President of the Goa Philately and Numismatics Society, Dr M R Ramesh Kumar, is a retired chief scientist at CSIR-NIO, Dona Paula. Dr Ramesh had been contemplating writing a book on philately for several years. Finally, he released his book, 'Tiny Treasures - The Science and History behind the World of Stamps' with the support of Shubha Subramaniam, who helped clear his doubts and edited the book, which brought his vision to life. "In fact, I wanted her to be my co-author, but she declined," he says. **A LEGACY IN PHILATELY** With a philatelic journey spanning almost seven decades, Dr. Ramesh found the motivation to document his experiences to benefit future generations. "Initially, I thought of compiling my previously published articles but later realized that a structured book would serve a better purpose," he explains. His book is dedicated to his three mentors: his father, the late MV Ranganatha Pai, late Balakrishna Das, founding member of the South India Philatelic Association (SIPA), Chennai, and VR Navelkar, founding member of the Goa Philately and Numismatics Society (GPNS). "A book can guide and inspire budding philatelists to take up this hobby seriously," he says. **PHILATELY: AN EDUCATIONAL TOOL AND INVESTMENT**

Exploring the World through stamps

Dr M R Ramesh Kumar is a passionate philatelist, who recently published the book, 'Tiny Treasures - The Science and History behind the World of Stamps'. He shares insights into the significance of philately in education

Dr Ramesh strongly believes that philately serves as an excellent educational tool. "Each stamp tells a story, teaching students and seniors alike about geography, culture, heritage, and science," he says. Beyond its educational value, he highlights its investment potential. "A special cover released by GPNS during the Covid-19 period, originally priced at Rs 30, was valued at Rs 300 within a week—an excellent return in no time."

His book emphasizes the versatility of stamp collection, which appeals to a variety of interests. "There is a stamp for everyone, whether it's environmental themes, sports, films, science, culture, history, or heritage. Kids, for example, love to collect stamps featuring sports or Disney characters."

ADVICE FOR YOUNG PHILATELISTS

For children starting in philately, Dr Ramesh suggests beginning with local themes. "I encourage them to collect stamps related to Goa—its history, biodiversity, and freedom fighters. They can also focus on sports like football, chess, and cricket, which are popular in Goa," he says. He also recommends assembling a basic philatelic toolkit, including a washing tray, magnifying glass, stock book, blotting paper, catalogue, acid-free plastic sheets, and A4-sized sheets for displaying stamps.

Philately in the Digital Age Finding philatelic material is easier than ever, thanks to both offline and online sources. "In Goa, we have an excellent Philatelic Bureau in Panjim with helpful staff. The GPNS also assists budding philatelists in completing their collections and guiding them through various stages," he shares.

Dr M R Ramesh Kumar will be conducting a session today, February 27 on 'Goa's Culture and Heritage through Philately' the Goa Children's Festival and Book Fair 2025 at Story Couch, Ravindra Bhavan, Margao at 11.30 am.

Students can acquire stamps through exchanges, philatelic dealers, and online platforms like Amazon, Flipkart, and eBay. Postcrossing is another great way to receive stamps from pen friends abroad. **SPREADING THE LOVE FOR PHILATELY** Dr Ramesh actively visits schools across India

Dr Ramesh conducts interactive philatelic activities in schools and colleges across India. "I distribute Meghdoot Postcards related to the Goa Liberation Movement and encourage students to mail them to me. This helps them familiarize themselves with their local post offices and postal services," he shares. He also organizes philatelic quizzes to make stamp collecting more engaging. He also highlights the Government of India's Sparsh Scholarship, which supports young philatelists through competitive tests. "Five to six students from various schools in Goa have won this scholarship, further encouraging them to pursue this hobby." The book is available on Amazon, Broadway Book Store, and Varsha Book Stall in Panjim, as well as directly from the author.

Dr Ramesh's book is designed for readers of all ages. He elaborates on the variety of philatelic materials collectors can explore, including mint and used stamps, first-day covers, special covers, miniature sheets, maximum cards, and commemorative cancellations for significant occasions like World Ozone Day and Mother Tongue Day.

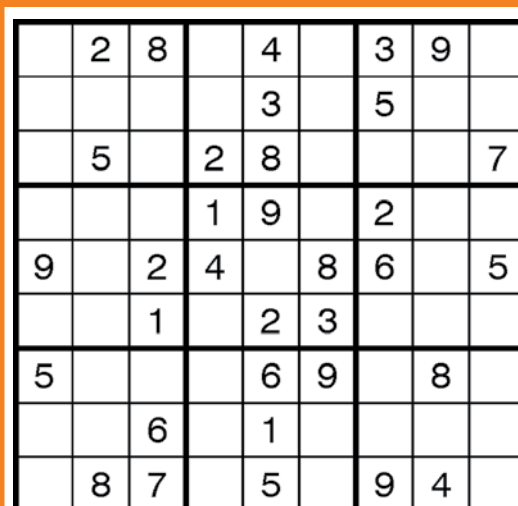
