

## Chowgule College's English Tygers attend Kala Ghoda Arts Festival



The Department of English at Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, (Autonomous) attended the 25th Anniversary celebrations of Kala Ghoda Arts Festival at Mumbai, as a part of their annual field trip to the festival spanning over a decade. Sixteen English major students, including two MA English students, and two professors, assistant professor Loretta Rodrigues and assistant professor Andrew Barreto, attended five days of the nine day long programme that consisted of various literary sessions, workshops, heritage walks, book chats and more.

The students, part of the departmental club English Tygers, attended at least 20 various sessions through the days. The students met



with the curators of the literature section of the festival, Pervin Saket, and Anil Menon, at the David Sassoon Library (DSL) and festival director Brinda Miller. This year being its silver jubilee anniversary, the festival had special sessions and attractions, which the contingent were lucky enough to get into, as many had limited seating.

The biggest highlight of the trip was meeting with veteran actor Boman Irani, Cyrus Broacha, Chef Cyrus Todiwala, hosted by Kunal Vijaykar at The Taj Mahal Palace, at an intimate Parsi food discussion session. The Goan connection was immediately established with Cyrus Todiwala talking to the students in Konkani, when he came to know that we were from Goa. He spoke of his mentor who was Goan, and of all the Goan influence in Parsi cooking.

Students also had a chat with actor Taha Shah Badusha, of 'HeeraMandi' fame, where his down to earth interactions with the students left them highly impressed. Students also met with Devdutt Patnaik, post his session on 'Marriage, Murder and Mythology', where they got his book signed. 'Pride and Pronoun: Modern Queer Narratives', was another eye-opening session as the students study the same in their Gender Studies course was led by Dr Raj Rao, Santa Khurai, and Harish Iyer.

The contingent watched three plays, 'Something Like' that presented by Social Manch, Peace Projects, 'Piyaakad' by Makarand Deshpande, and 'The Greatest Show on Earth' presented by Water Lily. The diverse range of plays, and the meet-up post the plays with the esteemed cast were truly cherished. Students were also lucky enough to catch one of the last stand-up comedy 'The Grin' line-up performances by Tarang Hardikar, Urjita Wani, Sumner More, Shamik Chakraborty, and meet with the comedians, namely Atul Khatri, Sharon Verma, and Urooj Ashfaq.

Other immersive sessions were on hands-on mithai making at the Bombay sweet shop, and food trails, writing workshops, a magical concert by Sachin-Jigar, and an interaction with actor Vicky Kaushal. The trip was educational, impactful and a 'core memory' for the visiting students.

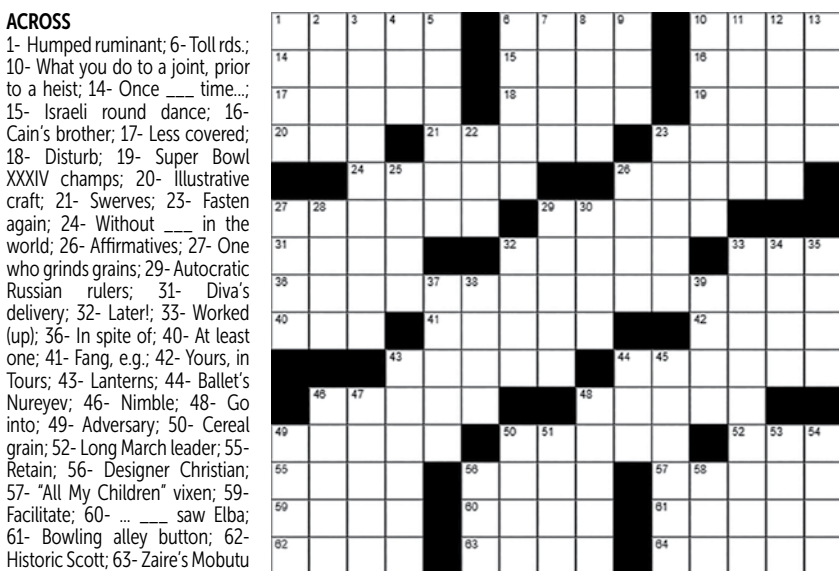

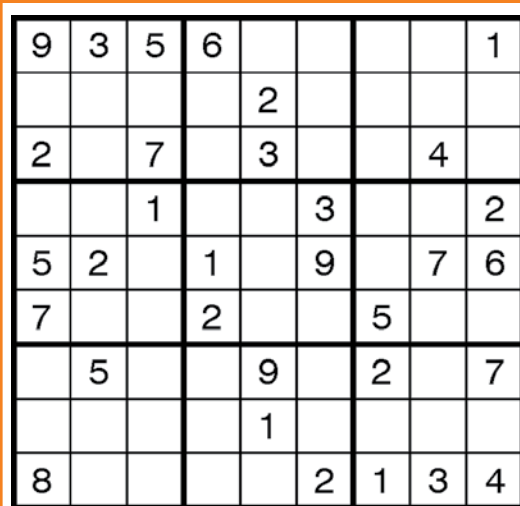
