

BAJRANG DAL MENACE AT UDAY BHEMBRE'S DOOR

Shocking incident of late-night intimidation as gang of 20-25 threatens ex-MLA over his video reacting to CM's comments on Chhatrapati Shivaji

MARGAO: A menacing scene unfolded in Margao late on Friday, when a gang of 20-25 Bajrang Dal members led by State Convener Viraj Dessai knocked on the door of Uday Bhemre - former MLA and writer - demanding an explanation for his take on Chief Minister Pramod Sawant's comments about Chhatrapati Shivaji.

The octogenarian, however, refused to be cowed and stood his ground even as his family and friends gathered within minutes to confront the men, who dis-

persed after uttering a litany of threats.

Before that, the group forced the senior citizen and his wife to come out of the house, threatened, mocked and questioned them, in an attempt to intimidate one of Goa's most respected leaders, who played a pivotal role in Goa's historic Opinion Poll.

Bhemre, also a former journalist, recently made a video reacting to Chief Minister Pramod Sawant's remarks praising and



detailing Chhatrapati Shivaji's contributions to Goa's history. The group claimed that the sentiments of the Hindu community and followers of Chhatrapati Shivaji were hurt by Bhemre's remarks.

Led by Dessai, the group demanded to know why he was making such videos and asserted that he was not an authority figure to speak on Chhatrapati Shivaji or Maratha history.

MLA confronts electricity dept over closing pathways

Kashinath Shetye, Sankalp Amonkar in war of words over road access issue in Mormugao

VASCO: A few days after cable-cutting in Panjim on his watch led to an internet blackout, Electricity Department Executive Engineer Kashinath Shetye was embroiled in a fresh controversy on Friday, as he got embroiled in a war of words with Mormugao MLA Sankalp Amonkar over closing two traditional pathways in Bogda, which have been in use for over 50 years.

The heated altercation between the two, which unfolded in front of locals, saw Amonkar demand the reopening of the two closed pathways, while Shetye insisted on their closure. As the nodal officer for land acquisition and property management, Shetye had gone to Bogda to inspect the quarters belonging to the Electricity Department.

Amonkar accused Shetye

of harassing local residents and acting more like an activist than a government official, and asked him to "act as an officer".

According to Amonkar, the question of the traditional pathway at Bogda has been pending resolution for a long time and he had raised the matter in the Assembly last year. Claiming that most of the 300 houses there date back to the Portuguese era, he said, "No officer has the right to call them ille-

gal or behave rudely with the public. Officers who do not understand local issues and work against the government should be terminated."

Amonkar refuted Shetye's claims that an illegal bar operated in the area, stating that the bar had held a valid license since 1985, well before the construction of the Electricity Department quarters.

Times have changed and so has Goa's Carnival

A 1960s Carnival in Goa may not have been exactly what you imagine it to be for that's when traditions made way for transformation


Think Carnival and the first image that comes to mind is that of King Momo. He is, today, on every poster or post or reel, advertising the Goa Carnival. But it was not always so. There was a time when Carnival in Goa was not synonymous with King Momo. Take a glance at the 1964 Goa Carnival postcard of Mario de Miranda pictured alongside, there is, as one can see, no King Momo in it, just people in masks having fun on the streets and a lady on the balcony above drenching the revellers with water or perhaps she is just watering her plants. That is because the first King

Momo trundled through the streets of Panjim precisely 60 years ago in 1965.

That story of Timoteo Fernandes, then a young 29 as the first King Momo riding on a bullock cart, to the sounds of music and, from the sidelines, looks of surprise is part of Carnival folklore, repeated often. The stories, as Timoteo recounts even today, his eyes lighting up at the memories, especially of how the entire float cost a mere Rs 5 and that the bullocks drawing the cart were frightened by the loud music and had to be calmed

down by the cart owner, bring smiles to the faces of the listeners as they do to Timoteo's countenance. It was that impromptu Carnival King Momo of 1965 that gave Goa a new manner of celebrating the festival.

But, when one looks back, was it all that spontaneous,



even for that time? King Momo could not have taken Goa by storm if not for the two clubs of Panjim - Clube Nacional and Clube Vasco da Gama - supporting the idea. Though there is no report of the first King Momo parade of 1965 in the pages of O Herald, there is an advertisement, reproduced here, of Clube Nacional inviting people to gather on Fat Saturday of 1965 to welcome King Momo.
