Pune bus rape: Thirst forced accused to come out of hiding

Cop's brother provided crucial tip-off leading to the arrest

PTI, MUMBAI: Thirst forced the accused in the Swargate bus rape case to leave the field he was hiding in and approach a house to seek water, but the owner, brother of a police constable, promptly alerted the police teams who were on his trail, leading to the arrest, officials said on Friday.

A ligature mark was found on his neck, and as per the preliminary probe, he tried to hang himself from a tree in the field in which he was hiding for two days, but the rope snapped and the suicide attempt failed, officials said.

Police had pressed into service sniffer dogs and drones with thermal image cameras to hunt for him after realizing that he was probably hiding in the fields, but finally human intelligence proved most helpful, said an official. As the police surrounded

SC refuses to hear plea against temporary release of Gurmeet Ram Rahim

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday refused to hear a plea of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) against the temporary release of Dera Sacha Sauda chief Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh.

A bench of Justices B R Gavai and Prashant Kumar Mishra had a plea before them challenging the Punjab and Haryana High Court order. The bench noted Singh's counsel objection to the PIL before the high court, which it disposed of, on the ground that it was filed against a single per-

son, who was Singh. "In that view of the matter, we are not inclined to consider the present petition," the bench said. Singh is serving a 20-year jail term for raping two of his disciples. The SGPC moved the apex court against an August 2024 order of the high court. The high court disposed of the SGPC's PIL observing in case an application was filed by Singh for temporary release, the same should be considered by the competent authority without any "arbitrariness or favouritism".

All parameters normal after trials of Union Carbide toxic waste disposal begins: Officials

PTI, INDORE: The trial incineration of 10 tonnes of waste linked to the 1984 Bhopal Gas Tragedy commenced on Friday in Pithampur area of Madhya Pradesh's Dhar district with initial reports indicating that air quality and other monitored parameters remained within normal ranges, officials said here.

This trial disposal, which involves 10 tonnes out of a total of 337 tonnes of hazardous waste, is being conducted following directives from the Madhya Pradesh High Court. "We started the process of burning 10 tonnes of waste in the designated plant's incinerator at 3pm under strict monitoring of the MP Pollution Control Board. All reports are normal at present. Air quality

and other parameters are normal," Indore division commissioner Deepak Singh, who visited the site, told reporters. On January 6, the HC had directed the state government to take steps within six weeks to dispose of the waste by following safety guidelines. In its order of February 18, MP Chief Justice Suresh Kumar Kait and

Justice Vivek Jain had directed that the state government undertake "first trial run of 10 metric ton by taking all protocols into consideration" on February 27. "If there is no adverse effect, the second trial run will take place on March 4, followed by the third trial run on March 10. Thereafter, based on results of same, after the due tests,

they will continue to dispose of the remaining waste and file the status report," the HC said. The Supreme Court had, on February 27, refused to interfere with the order of the Madhya Pradesh High Court to transfer and dispose of the waste. The bench of Justice BR Gavai and Justice AG Masih had also refused to stay the test process.

Militants open fire at Meitei religious site in Imphal

PTI, IMPHAL: Amid mass surrender of firearms by village volunteers in strife-torn Manipur, unidentified militants on Friday opened fire at a Meitei religious site in Imphal East district from adjoining hills, officials said. However, no casualties were reported in the incident.

The incident took place around 9.30 am when a group of devotees, under heavy security cover, visited Kongba Maru, a sacred site for Meiteis, to offer prayers, they said. A total of seven rounds were fired from adjoining hills but no person was injured in the incident, the officials said, adding additional security forces have been sent to the spot.

After the firing incident, irate locals from nearby villages came out on the streets and blocked vehicular traffic to register their protest. Kongba Maru had earlier witnessed vandalism

of temple properties by miscreants allegedly from the adjoining hill areas of Kangpokpi district. Earlier in the day, Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla extended the deadline for the surrender of looted and illegal firearms till 4 pm on March 6 following demands by people from both hill and valley areas for additional time, an official statement said.

109 WEAPONS SURRENDERED IN FOUR MANIPUR DISTRICTS PTI, IMPHAL: A total of 109 different types of weapons, along with various ammunition and other miscellaneous items, were surrendered by the public to police and security forces in four districts of strife-torn Manipur, police said on Friday. At Saikul police station in Kangpokpi district, one 9mm CB1A1 pistol, one 9mm magazine, one grenade, cartridges, and two wireless sets, along with other items, were surrendered on Thursday. Weapons, including one SBLL gun, were surrendered at Phougakchao Ikhai police station in Bishnupur district. Additionally, arms and ammunition were surrendered in various police stations in Imphal West and Imphal East districts, police added. On February, Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla had urged people of the state to voluntarily surrender looted and illegally held weapons within seven days, assuring no punitive action would be initiated against those giving up arms during this period. More than 250 people have been killed and thousands rendered homeless in ethnic violence between Imphal valley-based Meiteis and adjoining hills-based Kuki-Zo groups since May 2023.
