Israel cuts off Gaza aid to pressure Hamas to accept new ceasefire proposal

AP, TEL AVIV: Israel stopped the entry of all goods and supplies into the Gaza Strip on Sunday and warned of "additional consequences" if Hamas doesn't accept a new proposal to extend a fragile ceasefire, while key mediator Egypt accused Israel of using "starvation as a weapon."

Hamas accused Israel of trying to derail the ceasefire agreement hours after its first phase ended. It called the decision to cut off aid "cheap extortion, a war crime and a blatant attack" on the truce, which took hold in January after over a year of negotiations. Both sides stopped short of saying the ceasefire had ended.

The first phase, which included a surge in humanitarian assistance after months of growing hunger in the territory, expired on Saturday. The two sides have yet to negotiate the second phase, in which Hamas was to release dozens of remaining hostages in return for an Israeli pullout from Gaza and a lasting ceasefire. Talks should have begun a month ago.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelaty condemned Israel's decision as "a flagrant and clear violation of humanitarian law," and called for the immediate implementation of the second phase.

The International Committee of the Red Cross, which has facilitated the releases of hostages and Palestinian prisoners, said the ceasefire has saved

countless lives, and "any unraveling of the forward momentum created over the last six weeks risks plunging people back into despair."

Israel described the new proposal as a US one. There was no immediate comment from the United States, and it was not clear when US envoy Steve Witkoff, expected to visit the region last week, would arrive.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said that under the existing agreements Israel could resume fighting after the first phase if it believes negotiations are ineffective. He said the ceasefire would only continue if Hamas keeps releasing hostages, telling his Cabinet "there will be no free lunches." He said Israel was "fully coordinated" with President Donald Trump's administration.

The war has left most of Gaza's population of over

2 million dependent on international aid. Hundreds of aid trucks had entered Gaza daily since the ceasefire began on January 19, easing fears of famine raised by international experts.

But residents said prices doubled as word of the closure spread. "Everyone is worried," said Sayed al-Dairi in Gaza City. "This is not a life."

Fayza Nassar in the heavily destroyed urban Jabaliya refugee camp said the closure would worsen already dire conditions. "There will be famine and chaos," she said.

Hamas warns of consequences for hostages. Israel said the new proposal called for extending the ceasefire through Ramadan - the Muslim holy month that began over the weekend - and the Jewish Passover holiday, which ends on April 20.

AFP, TOKYO: Thousands of people evacuated from parts of northern Japan as the country's largest wildfire in three decades raged unabated Sunday after killing at least one person, officials said.

Around 2,000 people fled areas around the northern Japan city of Ofunato to stay with friends or relatives, while more than 1,200 evacuated to shelters, according to officials.

"We're still examining the size of the affected area, but it is the biggest since the 1992 wildfire" in Kushiro, Hokkaido, a disaster management agency spokesman told AFP Saturday. Some reports estimated the fire had spread over 1,800 hectares.

Aerial footage by NHK showed columns of white smoke billowing, four days

after the blaze first materialised, with military helicopters trying to douse them. One burned body has been discovered so far, with more than 80 buildings damaged and around 1,700 firefighters mobilised from across the country.

The number of wildfires has declined since the peak in the 1970s, according to government data, but there were about 1,300 across Japan in 2023 - concentrated in the February to April period when the air dries and winds pick up.

US aircraft carrier arrives in S Korea, days after N Korea test-fired missiles

PTI, SEOUL: A US aircraft carrier arrived in South Korea on Sunday in a show of force, days after North Korea test-launched cruise missiles to demonstrate its counterattack capabilities.

The arrival of the USS Carl Vinson and its strike group at the South Korean port of Busan was meant to display a solid US-South Korean military alliance in the face of persistent North Korean threats, and boost interoperability of the allies' combined assets, the South Korean navy said in a statement.

It said it was the first US aircraft carrier to travel to South Korea since June. The deployment of the

carrier is expected to infuriate North Korea, which views temporary deployments of such powerful US military assets as major security threats. North Korea has responded to some of the past deployments of US aircraft carriers, long-range bombers and nuclear-powered submarines with missile tests.

Since his Jan. 20 inauguration, President Donald Trump has said he will reach out to North Korean leader Kim Jong Un again to revive diplomacy. North Korea hasn't directly responded to Trump's overture but alleged US-led hostilities against North Korea have intensified since Trump's inauguration.

Ailing pope hails faithful's support and affection

AFP, ROME: Pope Francis, hospitalised for more than two weeks with double pneumonia, Sunday thanked believers around the world for their "support" and "affection" as he missed delivering a third straight Angelus prayer in person.

The 88-year-old pontiff, who has been treated at the Gemelli hospital in Rome since February 14, missed the traditional weekly prayer, which instead was published in the form of a letter the Vatican released at noon.

"I would like to thank you for the prayers, which rise up to the Lord from the hearts of so many faithful from many parts of the world. I feel

all your affection and closeness and, at this particular time, I feel as if I am 'carried' and supported by all God's people. Thank you all," wrote the Argentine pontiff. He concluded by calling for peace in addressing

conflicts around the globe. "I pray above all for peace. From here, war appears even more absurd. Let us pray for tormented Ukraine, Palestine, Israel, Lebanon, Myanmar, Sudan and Kivu," the pope wrote.

Intense heat changes our biology, can make us age significantly faster: Study

PTI, MELBOURNE: Heat takes it out of you. After a long, hot day, we feel tired and grumpy.

But sustained periods of heat do more than that they age us faster. Cumulative heat stress changes our epigenetics how our cells turn on or off gene switches in response to environmental pressure.

Now, new research from the United States explores the pressing question of how extreme heat affects

humans. The findings are concerning. The more days of intense heat a participant endured, the faster they aged. Longer periods of extreme heat accelerated ageing in older people by more than two years.

As the climate heats up, humans will be exposed to more and more heat and our bodies will respond to these stresses by ageing faster. These findings are especially

pertinent to Australia, where heatwaves are expected to become more frequent and intense in a warmer world.

How, exactly, does heat age us? Ageing is natural. But the rate of ageing varies from human to human. As we go through life, our bodies are affected by stresses and shocks. For instance, if we don't get enough sleep over a long period, we will age faster.

While heat can directly sicken or kill us, it also has a long tail. Sustained heat stresses our bodies and make them less efficient at doing the many jobs needed to stay alive. This is what we mean when we say it accelerates biological ageing. This deterioration is likely to precede the later development of diseases and disabilities.

What does that look like on a genetic level? You might think your

genes don't change over your life, and this is mostly true (apart from random mutations).

But what does change is how your genes are expressed. That is, while your DNA stays the same, your cells can switch some of its thousands of genes off or on in response to stresses. At any one time, only a fraction of the genes in any cell are turned on meaning they are busy making proteins.
