

Dempo SC struggle to hold fort, lose 1-2 to Delhi FC

MAHILPUR: Dempo Sports Club's struggles continued as they fell 1-2 to Delhi FC in the I-League 2024-25 match played at the Mahilpur Football Stadium, here, on Sunday, securing the hosts' first victory in 10 matches.

Dempo SC paid the price for a shaky first half, conceding twice in the first 20 minutes. Cameroonian forward Samir Binong put Delhi FC ahead inside four minutes, capitalising on a defensive lapse, before Zimbabwean defender Victor Kamhuka doubled the lead from a corner.

Marcus Joseph, the Trinidadian forward, pulled one back with a sublime free-kick in the 35th minute. However, despite a stronger second-half display, Dempo SC failed to capitalise on their momentum. With their second consecutive defeat, Dempo SC stay in ninth place with 19 points from 17 matches.

Delhi FC wasted no time and broke the deadlock within the first five minutes. A half-cleared corner fell to Hridaya Jain on the right. His whipped cross into the six-yard box found Binong, who slid in to finish after Dempo SC's Mohamed Ali misjudged the flight of the ball.

Dempo SC's fragile defence struggled under constant pressure. In the eighth minute, Binong nearly doubled his tally, weaving

past two defenders before forcing a sharp save from Ashish Sibi at his near post. However, Delhi FC's relentless pressing paid off in the 20th minute. Jain's corner found Kamhuka, who rose unchallenged and nodded home to make it 2-0.

Delhi FC almost sealed the game minutes later when Binong curled a shot toward the top corner, but Sibi produced a brilliant diving save to keep Dempo SC alive.

With Dempo SC on the verge of collapse, Marcus produced a moment of brilliance. In the 35th minute, the Trinidadian forward

curled a free kick around the wall and into the top corner, halving the deficit and injecting life into Dempo SC's attack.

The goal lifted the visitors and they came out in the second half with renewed intent. They frequently broke through Delhi FC's midfield, but a lack of precision in the final third cost them dearly. Their best chance came in the 55th minute when a long-range effort seemed destined for the bottom corner, only for Delhi FC keeper Debnath Mondal to produce a crucial save, diving low to his left.

Chhetri's late equaliser ends E Bengal play-offs charge

AGENCIES, KOLKATA: East Bengal FC drew 1-1 against Bengaluru FC in the Indian Super League match played at the Vivekananda Yuba Bharati Krirangan Stadium, here, on Sunday.

The Blues held an overwhelming 67.9 per cent of the possession, but needed the added time of the second half to grab a point from the fixture, ending East Bengal FC's playoff charge.

The Red and Gold Brigade, placed eighth, have 28 points from 23 games now, and could get to a maximum of 31 with one game remaining, which would still fall short of the currently sixth-placed NorthEast United FC (32).

East Bengal FC made a statement start with some telling moves that sparked a livewire inside the Bengaluru FC defensive third.

They particularly found openings on the right side of the Blues' backline, with Naorem Mahesh Singh embarking on an industrious run inside the 18-yard area before squaring the ball for Dimitrios Diamantakos.

The moment came through Saul Crespo, who was determined to find his footing within the penalty area. Saul momentarily lost balance though, but laid a short pass for Raphael Messi Bouli still. Messi Bouli cut in from the right, and shot from the centre of the box into the bottom left corner in the 11th minute, as Sandhu could not get his hands to the end of the shot.

The home side were however reduced to 10 men at the brink of the half-time whistle as Diamantakos was shown a red card following a feisty challenge. The Blues began optimising this one-man advantage by stretching the East Bengal FC defence through their quick sprints on the flank.

Momentum finally swayed in Bengaluru FC's favour at the 90th minute mark as Nishu Kumar ended up handling the ball while marking Sunil Chhetri inside the 18-yard zone. Chhetri assumed spot-kick duties, dispatching the ball into the bottom right corner with thorough composure, earning the draw for the visitors.
