# **High Court quashes FIR** in MLA extortion case

Imposes cost of Rs 1 lakh on petitioner, directed to deposit amount in Goa Police Welfare Fund

#### **Team Herald**

PANJIM: The High Court of Bombay at Goa on Tuesday quashed the FIR registered against Kukesh Rauta of Odisha who was arrested for alleg-edly extorting Rs 5 lakh from Aldona MLA Adv Carlos Alvares Ferreira after creating his morphed obscene video. The Court also imposed a cost of Rs 1 lakh on the petitioner and asked him to deposit the money in the Goa Police Welfare Fund, within a fortnight.

The Crime Branch police had arrested Rauta in December last year for allegedly extorting Rs 5 lakh from the Aldona MLA after morphing his face in an obscene video and further demanding Rs 5 crore from him.

Kukesh Rauta in his crimi-nal writ petition (WPCR) had prayed to quash the FIR stating

Speaking about the accident, the bus driver, Saddiq, said, "The crane came from the wrong direction and hit the bus. Its boom was out. Luckily, there were no passengers in the bus. I was on my way to the depot from Margao to Panjim. The loss caused is around Rs 1.80 lakh."

Authorities are expected to investigate the circumstances surrounding the accident.

As per prevailing norms, loud music is generally permitted only until 10 pm at public places.

The order, issued by Sachin Desai, Director and Ex-Officio Joint Secretary of Environment and Climate Change, emphasises that permissions will be granted on a case-tocase basis.

"The permission shall be granted only in response to a specific application made by the concerned village panchayat, municipal corporation, municipal council, or an individual in Goa," the order stated.

Furthermore, the order mandates strict adherence to the Noise Pollution (Regulation and Control) Rules, 2000, and states that the relevant authorities must monitor noise levels during permitted festive occasions and other events. "Prompt remedial action shall be taken in case of any violations," it added.
