Prague Masters: Praggnanandhaa to take on Shankland after lone rest day

Tied at the top spot with compatriot and friend Aravindh Chithambaram, Praggnanandhaa tried to break the defences of his fellow countryman for a long time but only ended up with a draw. The two are now on 3.5 points each out of a possible five. Aravindh was surprised after his second win in the tournament. The Indian, who has arrived big time in to the elite circles, now will have to tackle the experienced Quang Leim Le of Vietnam in the next round. The two Indians are followed by a pack of four players having 2.5 points each. The most dangerous of the lot is Wei Yi who started with two losses in the first three rounds and then won two in a row to send warning signals to his competitors. Anish Giri and Quang Leim hold the dubious distinction of drawing all the five games thus far while Vincent Keymer has lost two, drawn one and won two out

Boxing Federation of India to hold election on March 28

NEW DELHI: The Boxing Federation of India (BFI) Tuesday said it will hold its election on March 28 to elect new office bearers for the next four years. The development comes a day after the Delhi High Court stayed a decision of the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) to constitute an adhoc panel to run the affairs of the BFI. "The 10th Annual General Meeting of the Boxing Federation of India will be held under the chairmanship of Mr. Ajay Singh, President, Boxing Federation of India on the 28th Match, 2025 from 10.30am at Delhi NCR," the sport's apex governing body in the country said in a statement signed by its secretary general Hemanta Kumar Kalita. On the agenda will be the election of office bearers and other members of executive council of BFI for the tenure 2025-29. The BFI has also asked its affiliated state units to send the names of the representatives who will be attending the AGM by March 10. On Monday, Justice Sachin Datta issued notice to the IOA seeking its response to a petition filed by the federation challenging the decision of constituting the ad-hoc committee. The court granted two weeks' time to the IOA to file its reply to the petition and posted the hearing on March 27. On February 24, the IOA formed a five-member ad-hoc committee to oversee affairs, citing the federation's failure to conduct elections on time.

South Africa have bit more class and power compared to NZ: Ponting ahead of semis

LAHORE: South Africa have a "bit more class and power" in their lineup, which makes them favourites in the Champions Trophy semifinal against New Zealand, feels Ricky Ponting, though the Australian great added that if someone like Kane Williamson comes to the party he could get the job done for the Black Caps. New Zealand are coming into the knockouts on the back of a big defeat against India in Dubai, while South Africa are on a roll following their massive seven-wicket win against England in the group stage. While momentum could play a big role in the contest, Ponting said with a deep batting line-up, just like India, South Africa enjoy an edge. "If I look at both the sides, I think there's that little bit more class in the South African line-up. They bat deep. I think they might have a little bit too much power for New Zealand," Pointing opined on ICC Review on Tuesday. "I'm actually going with South Africa (to win the contest) as much as I've praised New Zealand,"

It's not size, but mental strength that matters: Gavaskar backs Rohit Sharma

DUBAI: Backing India captain Rohit Sharma, who was subjected to fat-shaming, cricket legend Sunil Gavaskar on Tuesday said that slim guys are for modelling and in cricket, mental strength is what matters, not physical size. Addressing the unnecessary criticisms directed at India skipper in the middle of Champions Trophy by a politician, Gavaskar reminded how Mumbai's big-hitting Sarfaraz Khan also faced body shaming, but it didn't affect his performance at all. "I have always said, if you want only slim guys, then you should go to a modelling competition and pick all the models. It's not about that," Gavaskar told India Today. "It's about how well you can play cricket. We talked about Sarfaraz Khan, he was vilified for a long time because he was on the heavier side. But if he scores 150 for India in a Test match and follows it up with another two or three fifty-plus scores, then what's the issue?" "I don't think size has anything to do with it. It's your mental strength whether you can last the distance that's the most important thing. Bat well, bat for long, and score runs."

Ronaldo-less Al-Nassr draws at Esteghlal in Asian Champions League Elite

TEHRAN: Cristiano Ronaldo was absent as Al-Nassr of Saudi Arabia and Esteghlal of Iran drew 0-0 in the first leg of the AFC Champions League Elite second round on Monday. It was a frustrating evening in Tehran for Al-Nassr without the 40-year-old Ronaldo, who has collected five UEFA Champions League titles with Manchester United and Real Madrid. Jhon Duran, signed from Aston Villa in January, came closest to scoring and former Liverpool star Sadio Mane had chances but Esteghlal goalkeeper Seyed Hossein Hosseini was in fine form. "I am satisfied with the performance of the players," Al-Nassr coach Stefano Pioli said. "It is important to remember that there is another game." The return match takes place in Riyadh on March 11.
