

PTI, BEIJING: A ballet between the elephant and the dragon contributing to each other's success is the "only right choice" for India-China relations, Foreign Minister Wang Yi said on Friday as he acknowledged positive strides in bilateral ties after the end of the military standoff in eastern Ladakh.

There is every reason for us to support each other rather than undermine each other or undercut each other, Wang, who is also a member of the powerful political bureau of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC), said at his annual press conference here.

A "cooperative pas de deux" between the dragon and the elephant is the "only right choice for both sides," Wang said while replying to a question on how Beijing views the course of

bilateral ties after the two countries ended the fourvear stalemate in the ties.

Bilateral relations between the two Asian giants froze after the Galwan valley clash in eastern Ladakh in June 2020. The four year military standoff ended last year.

"We should never allow bilateral relations to be defined by the boundary question or specific differences to affect the overall picture of our bilateral ties," he said in his widely televised press conference held on the sidelines of China's annual parliament session currently underway.

other or undercut each other, he said, adding that both the countries should work with each other rather than guard against each other.

"This is the only path that truly serves the fundamental interests of the two countries," Wang said.

As important members of the Global South, China and India have the responsibility to take a lead in opposing hegemonism and power politics, he said in an apparent reference to the United

stronger Global South will improve greatly," he said.

Wang said 2025 marks the 75th anniversary of China-India diplomatic relations. "China stands ready to work with India to sum up past experience and forge a path forward and advance China-India relations on the track of sound and stable development," he said.

In 2024, India and China completed the disengagement process after firming up a pact for the withdrawal of troops from Depsang and Demchok, the last two friction points in eastern Ladakh, ending the over four years of freeze in ties.

After the finalisation of the pact, Modi and Xi held talks in Kazan on October 23 when the two sides decided to revive the various dialogue mechanisms.

26/11 accused Tahawwur Rana seeks fresh stay on extradition to India

PTI. NEW YORK: Mumbai terror attack accused Tahawwur Rana has submitted a renewed application to Chief Justice John Roberts seeking a stay of his extradition to India after the US Supreme Court rejected his emergency bid.

Rana, 64, a Canadian national of Pakistani origin, is currently lodged in the Metropolitan Detention Center in Los Angeles. He had submitted an "Emergency Application For Stay Pending Litigation of Petition For Writ of Habeas Corpus" on February 27 with Elena Kagan, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States and Circuit Justice for the Ninth Circuit.

A note dated March 6 on the Supreme Court website said that "Application ...denied by Justice Kagan."

Rana has now renewed his "Emergency Application for Stay Pending Litigation of Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus" previously addressed to Justice



the renewed application be directed to Chief Justice Roberts," according to the submission by Rana's lawyers on Thursday posted on the court's website.

In his emergency application, Rana had sought a "stay of his extradition and surrender to India pending litigation (including exhaustion of all appeals) on the merits of his February 13 petition.

In that petition, Rana argued that his extradition to India violates United States law and the United Nations

Convention Against Torture "because there are substantial grounds for believing that, if extradited to India, the petitioner will be in danger of

being subjected to torture."

"The likelihood of torture in this case is even higher though as petitioner faces acute risk as a Muslim of Pakistani origin charged in the Mumbai attacks," the application said. The application also said that his "severe medical conditions" render extradition to Indian detention facilities a "de facto" death sentence in this case. It cited medical records

Migrant boats capsize near Yemen, Djibouti; 2 dead, 186 missing

AP, CAIRO: Four boats carrying migrants from Africa capsized overnight in waters off Yemen and Djibouti, the UN migration agency said Friday. At least two people died, and 186 others were missing.

Two of the boats capsized off Yemen late Thursday, said Tamim Eleian, a spokesperson for the International Organisation for Migration. Two crewmembers were rescued, but 181 migrants and five Yemeni crewmembers remain missing, he told The Associated Press.

Two other boats capsized off the tiny African nation of Djibouti around the same time, he said. Two bodies of migrants were recovered, and all others on board were rescued.

Despite a nearly decade-long civil war, Yemen is a major route for migrants from East Africa and the Horn of Africa trying to reach Gulf countries for work, with Two other boats capsized off the tiny African nation of Djibouti around the same time, he said. hundreds of thousands attempting the route each year. To reach Yemen, migrants are taken by smugglers on often dangerous. overcrowded boats across the Red Sea or Gulf of Aden. The numbers making it to

Yemen reached 97,200 in 2023 triple the number in 2021.

Last year, the number dropped to just under 61,000, probably because of greater patrolling of the waters, according to an IOM report this month. Over the past decade, at least 2,082 migrants have disappeared along the route, including 693 known to have drowned. according to the IOM. Some 380,000 migrants are currently in Yemen.


