UP MAN ARRESTED FOR BRUTALLY ASSAULTING WIFE AND CHILDREN

CALANGUTE: A 30-year-old man from Uttar Pradesh, identified as Salman Ayub, was arrested on Saturday for brutally assaulting his 22-year-old wife and three minor children at around 2.30 pm in Gauravaddo, Calangute. According to police reports, Ayub attacked his wife and children using a wooden stick, striking them on their heads. He also used a carpentry tool, causing severe injuries to their hands. Two of the children were treated and later discharged from the hospital.

Following his arrest, Ayub was taken to the Institute of Psychiatry and Human Behaviour (IPHB) for evaluation and treatment. Calangute police have registered a case under Sections 118(1) and 118(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, along with Section 8 of the Goa Children's Act, 2003. Further investigation is underway.

TWO ARRESTED IN VASCO FOR POSSESSING OVER 4 KG OF SUSPECTED GANJA

VASCO: Vasco police arrested two individuals on Friday for allegedly possessing over 4 kg of suspected ganja, valued at Rs 4 lakh in the open market. The accused have been identified as Yesunand Souza (33) from Khanapur-Belagavi and James Swamy, also known as Ayan Rafiq Shaikh (35), from Lohegaon-Pune. The duo were caught red-handed near Laxmi Temple at Kharewado-Vasco. Police recovered 4.028 kg of suspected ganja from Souza, while Swamy was apprehended for aiding and abetting the crime. A case has been registered against both under Sections 20 (ii) (b) (B) and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. Authorities have informed the respective police stations in Belagavi and Pune to notify the families of the accused. PSI Mayur K. Sawant is investigating the case under the supervision of Vasco PI Kapil Nayak.

ELDERLY WOMAN SUCCUMBS TO BURN INJURIES AT GMC

MARGAO: Smita Lottikar, 70, resident of Amrut Plaza, Ambaji, Fatorda, succumbed to burn injuries while undergoing treatment at Ward No. 117 of Goa Medical College (GMC), Bambolim. According to Fatorda police, they received a wireless message from GMC reporting the woman's death, following which a police team visited the hospital. During their inquiry, it was revealed that the victim had been admitted to South Goa District Hospital (SGDH) on March 6 after sustaining burn injuries at her residence. She was later referred to GMC for further treatment. Police investigations at the scene of the incident, and an inquiry with her husband, revealed that the fire broke out when she attempted to light a diya using a gas lighter. The lighter allegedly burst, igniting her nightdress and causing severe burns.

WOMAN FOUND DEAD IN RENTED ROOM AT KUNDAI IDC

MARGAO: A 47-year-old woman, identified as Jyotsana Kisku, was found dead in her rented room near Rudra Electricals at Kundai Industrial Development Corporation (IDC), Ponda. According to sources at the South Goa District Police Headquarters, Kisku, a native of West Bengal, was reportedly suffering from depression due to personal issues. Police investigations revealed that she was alone in her room during the evening. When her friend, Kartik Hansda, also a native of West Bengal, returned, he found the door latched from inside. Sensing something was wrong, he forced the door open and discovered that Kisku had died by hanging. Hansda immediately untied the knot, lowered the body, and informed emergency services by calling 108. Police conducted a panchanama of the scene and an inquest panchanama, after which the body was preserved at the Sub-District Hospital morgue for medico-legal formalities. Further investigations are ongoing.

DR WISEMAN TO CHAIR NAT CONFERENCE OF INDIAN MUSCULO SKELETAL ONCOLOGY STY

RS 100-CRORE INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS LAUNCHED IN BARDEZ COASTAL BELT

CALANGUTE: Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on Wednesday launched infrastructure projects worth Rs 100 crore in Calangute, assuring that the long-pending sewerage system in the area would be upgraded. Speaking at the foundation stone-laying ceremony at the Calangute panchayat hall, Sawant highlighted the state's efforts in developing tourism-related infrastructure. "A lot of tourists from 45 countries visit Goa. We have created some of the best infrastructure in roads, rail, air, water, power, sewage, and waste management. It is unmatched anywhere else in the country," he said. The new projects include a 33KV underground electricity network from the 220/33KV GIS station at Saligao to substations in Calangute, Nagoa-Arpora, Badem-Asagao, and the proposed Baga substation. A 300mm water pipeline will also be laid from St Anthony Chapel to the 1.2 MLD sump at Umtawado, which was constructed over five years ago. Additionally, roads damaged due to underground cable work will be repaired.

Bull gores caretaker to death

VASCO: In a tragic incident, Mehboob Walikar (32), a caretaker from Zuarinagar Birla, was killed after he was attacked by a bull near Velsao lake.

Walikar and his colleague were managing a cowshed in Birla and on Friday, one of their bulls went missing.

They searched the next morning and spotted the bull in the lake. Walikar entered the water to retrieve the bull and asked his colleague to wait.

However, as he reached near the bull, the latter turned aggressive and charged and grievously injured him. His colleague immediately raised an alarm and hearing his cries, the locals rushed to the lake and rushed Walikar to the PHC at Cansaulim, where he was declared dead on arrival by the doctor.

The locals managed to subdue and tie-up the bull.

Tivrem-Orgao farmers' dreams shattered, bandhara breach leaves crops submerged

PONDA: Hopes of bumper harvest were dashed as farmers from Tivrem-Orgao panchayat jurisdiction suffered crop losses after a riverside bandhara breached, which left their crops submerged under saline water.

After working hard a few months ago to grow various vegetable crops, the farmers were in for a rude shock as they noticed a major breach in the bandhara near the manas at Zuvarewada, Tivrem-Orgao where over 50 acres of paddy fields were submerged under saline water since Sunday, affecting their crop.

The farmers, who learnt about the breach in the bandhara, gathered at the site and began the repair work via traditional method of using mud filled bags. However, they demanded that the Agriculture Department provide a permanent solution to protect their fields from recurring breaches.

According to the farmers, the centuries old bandharas are breaching during high tide. The entry of saline water has left the vegetables

submerged. They claimed that weakened bandhara has breached on account of the holes created by crabs.

Farmers said that if such a situation persists, then their paddy fields will become uncultivable, forcing them to

abandon agriculture and to keep the land fallow.


Narayan Vittal Gaude and other farmers said they had grown various vegetable crops such as chilli and lady finger, but they noticed that their crops, which were ready for harvesting, sub-

merged due to the breach in the bandhara.

Narayan said, "We suffered crop loss when we were hoping to reap the benefits by selling excess crops in the market. The government should compensate us for crop loss."

Historic First: Sharat Raikar appointed as first-ever Konkani Parliamentary Interpreter

Rental vehicle ban at Mopa to boost taxi owners: Ex-MLA
