DKA celebrated the Birth Centenary of Late Evagrio Jorge

Dalgado Konknni Akademi (DKA) celebrated the Birth Centenary of Late Evagrio Jorge, at his residence in Carmona. The event featured the garlanding of his portrait as a mark of respect for his numerous sacrifices as a dedicated citizen. Cyriaco Dias, a renowned tiatrist and vice president of the Freedom Fighters' Association, was the chief guest. Fr Roland Carvalho, parish priest of Our Lady of Socorro Church, Carmona, graced the occasion as the guest of honour. Prominent attendees included Subhas Naik and Sabina Martins, son and daughter-in-law of Evagrio, respectively; Vijayalakshmi, his sister; Sandra Fernandes, Sarpanch of Carmona; Celso Fernandes, president of DKA; Fr Myron Barreto, DKA Secretary; Afonso Braganza, DKA treasurer; as well as Evagrio's family members, former colleagues, and villagers from Carmona. Evagrio Francisco Jorge was



born on March 6, 1925, in Carmona. During his youth, he actively opposed the Portuguese occupation of Goa and joined the freedom struggle movement, advocating for the Portuguese to leave Goa. His involvement led to three arrests and two imprisonments. Jorge participated in the Civil Disobedience Movement, led by Dr Ram Manohar Lohia in Margao, and offered Satyagraha at Cuncolim in November 1946, protesting against

Portuguese rule. Prior to 1954, Evagrio Francisco Jorge worked with prominent newspapers, including O Herald, Diario de Goa, and Azad Goem. He later joined All India Radio (AIR) as a senior-grade scriptwriter, serving in New Delhi, Mumbai, and eventually Goa. Jorge resigned from AIR to assume the role of Editor at the Konkani daily newspaper Uzvadd. He was a prolific writer, publishing numerous pamphlets and books in

Portuguese, Konkani, and English. Evagrio Francisco Jorge passed away on August 20, 1978.

In his speech, Cyriaco Dias underscored the remarkable sacrifices Evagrio Jorge made as a freedom fighter, activist, writer, and editor. He expressed his appreciation for Dalgado Konknni Akademi's efforts in commemorating and celebrating the birth centenary of this illustrious freedom fighter. Fr Myron Barreto extended a warm welcome to the gathering, highlighted Evagrio Jorge's remarkable contributions, and exhorted the audience to emulate his example in promoting justice, truth, and the well-being of all.

Sabina Martins, daughter-in-law of Evagrio, proposed the vote of thanks. Sonia Gomes expertly compered the function, which concluded with the singing of the National Anthem.






