Mangrove Unit launched at Govt College, Quepem



The Mangrove Society of India (MSI) launched the Mangrove Unit at the Government College of Arts, Science, and Commerce, Quepem with the aim of raising awareness about mangrove conservation among students.

The event began with a skit performed by the college students, which depicted the rising threat of mangrove degradation and its negative impact on the biodiversity of the ecosystem. The performance set the tone for the importance of conservation in the face of environmental challenges.

Dr Pravina Kerkar, principal of the college, emphasized the urgent need to conserve this fragile and vital ecosystem. Dr Vinod Dhargalkar, Executive Secretary of MSI, presented the certificate for the Mangrove Unit and a memento to Dr Pravina as part of the inauguration. Dr Vinod gave an insightful presentation on the overview of the mangrove ecosystem, explaining its crucial role in maintaining

The keynote speaker for the evening was Adv Eeshan Usapkar, a lawyer, trainer, and multiple award winner. He began by emphasizing on the Constitution of India as the foundation of democracy that balances freedoms with necessary restrictions. He highlighted the concept of equal laws for equal people and unequal laws for unequal people

and provided insights into the New Criminal Laws and their effectiveness.

Given the rise in cybercrime, Adv Usapkar stressed the importance of updating passwords regularly and shared the Cyber Crime Helpline Number. He also elaborated on Goa's Uniform Civil Code particularly the Communion of Assets, surprising many in the audience with its unique provisions. Additionally, he discussed consumer rights, guiding attendees on filing complaints through E-Dakhil, the online consumer complaint portal.
