

People's fast bears fruit, quarrying halted near Tillari

Khanyale locals withdraw fast after Sindhudurg Collector's directive; Goan environmentalist wants Maha to issue a permanent stoppage order

BICHOLIM: Khanyale villagers withdrew their week-long hunger strike following Sindhudurg District Collector Anil Patil's directive stopping operations of stone quarries and crushing units as well as transportation near the Tillari Dam, until further orders.

The directive is in response to the protests by Khanyale villagers over illegal mining activities in the area. Approximately, seven such units were operational in the ecologically-sensitive region using limited period minor mineral mining permits. The decision has been taken following discussion with the officials which pointed out that the mining activities can have detrimental impact on the

Tiger sighted in camera trap tech at Khanyale

PANJIM: A tiger has been sighted in camera trap technique at Shinrage, Khanyale in Dodamarg, thereby reiterating the presence of eight tigers in the Mangeli and Amboli regions of Maharashtra. According to information available, a male tiger "T-40" was spotted in the camera trap laid by the Sahyadri Tiger Reserve and the Sawantwadi Forest Division under the guidance of conservation biologist Girish Punjabi. Confirming the presence of tigers in Mangeli and Amboli wildlife corridor across the Goa border, environmentalist Rajendra Kerkar said, "Presence of eight tigers in the Mangeli and Amboli regions have already been proved. A male tiger was recently captured in the camera trap technique at Shirange, Khanyale in Dodamarg taluka and the officials of the Sahyadri Tiger Reserve and Sawantwadi forest division are closely monitoring the happenings."


Holi picnic turns tragic, two drown in Usgao-Ganjam river

Classes VI to X & XII to begin from April

PANJIM: The Directorate of Education released the draft rules for commencing the new academic year for Classes VI to X and Class XII from April this year, with

one week break between the end of year and the beginning of the new academic year for these classes.

As per the notification, the academic year for Class I to V and Class IX shall ordinarily commence from

June and end in April.

"The academic year for Classes VI to X and Class XII shall ordinarily commence from April and shall end in March," it stated.

Cabinet reshuffle likely within a fortnight: Speaker

PANJIM: Speaker of the Goa Legislative Assembly Ramesh Tawadkar, on Friday, hinted at a possible Cabinet reshuffle, which he said could take place within a fortnight.

Speaking to mediapersons, he said the government will not take much time for the reshuffling exercise, which will be sorted out within the next 15 days.

"It would not take much time and it will be clear who will be in and who will be out. Names of Nilesh Cabral, Digambar Kamat, Sankalp Amonkar, Delilah Lobo and Michael Lobo are cropping up. But I think the issue will be sorted soon," he said.

In the first week of this month, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) General Secretary (Organisation) B L Santosh had met Chief Minister Pramod Sawant and other State party leaders. The one-on-one meetings with the Chief Minister, BJP MLAs and ministers were held at a hotel in the capital

UN report accuses Israel of sexual violence against Palestinians

AP, GENEVA: United Nations-backed human rights experts on Thursday accused Israel of "the systematic use of sexual, reproductive and other gender-based violence" in its war with Hamas in the Gaza Strip.

The allegations came in one of the most extensive reports of its kind on the issue since Hamas' October 7, 2023 attack on southern Israel ignited the war.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu lashed out at the Human Rights Council, a UN-backed body that commissioned the team of independent experts, as an "anti-Israel circus" that "has long been exposed as an anti-emitic, rotten, terrorist-supporting, and irrelevant body". His statement did not address the findings themselves.

The team, coached by Mohd Faizal Bin Sood of Malaysia, will compete in Group A alongside hosts Thailand, Kuwait, and Lebanon. India will open their campaign against Thailand on March 20, followed by matches against Kuwait on
