

## GU TEACHER'S NAME COMES UP IN QUESTION PAPER THEFT SCANDAL

### Asst Prof of Physics accused of stealing paper to help female student; complaint filed at Agassaim PS; university initiates inquiry

PANJIM: Goa University has been rocked by allegations that an assistant professor stole a question paper to help a female student secure high marks in the examination. The university administration has initiated an inquiry into the incident, confirmed Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Harilal Menon.

“The matter was brought to the notice of Goa University but no action was taken. The incident was hushed up by the Registrar and Vice Chancellor of the University. ### DUPLICATE KEY USED TO ACCESS QUESTION PAPERS: COMPLAINT

■ The complaint alleged that an assistant professor from the Physics Dept allegedly accessed the question papers using a duplicate key a few days before the examination

■ After logging into the computer in another professor's cabin, the accused reportedly provided the stolen question paper to a particular student, enabling her to secure high marks in the exam

■ The complaint names the accused professor, high-ranking university officials, and a political leader as being complicit in the incident

■ The complainants have demanded a thorough probe and strict action against those involved

■ They alleged the professor tried to get the student into the Physics Dept despite she securing very low marks

## Macedonia nightclub fire kills 59, leaves 155 injured

AP, KOCANI: A massive fire tore through a nightclub in North Macedonia's eastern town of Kocani early Sunday, killing 59 people and injuring 155, authorities said.

The blaze broke out around 2.30 am during a concert by a local pop group at Club Pulse, Interior Minister Panche Toshkovski told reporters.

He said 39 of the dead had so far been identified.

He said, following an initial assessment, pyrotechnics likely caused the roof to catch fire. Videos showed chaos inside the club, with young people running through the smoke as the musicians urged people to escape as quickly as possible.


As relatives gathered outside hospitals to await news, Kocani resident Dragi Stojanov was informed that his 21-year-old son Tomce had died in the fire.

"He was my only child. I don't need my life anymore," he said. "One hundred and fifty families have been devastated."

Officials said the injured have been taken to hospitals around the country, including the capital, Skopje, many with severe burns. The effort was being assisted by multiple volunteer organisations.

## Immigration Bill: 7-yr jail for using forged passport

PTI, NEW DELHI: Anyone found using a forged passport or visa for entering, staying or exiting India will be punished with a jail term of up to seven years and a fine to the extent of Rs 10 lakh if the new immigration bill is approved by Parliament.

The legislation, piloted by the Union Home Ministry, also provides for mandatory reporting of information about foreigners by hotels, universities, other educational institutions, hospitals and nursing homes to enable tracking of overstaying foreigners.

The Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025 is a comprehensive legislation to regulate all matters relating to foreigners and immigration.

## Drug cartel busted in K'taka

### MDMA worth Rs 75 crore seized, two South Africans held in Bengaluru

PTI, MANGALURU: Mangaluru Police seized over 37 kg of MDMA valued at Rs 75 crore, the biggest-ever drug haul in the State, a police official said on Sunday.

Two South African nationals were arrested in Bengaluru in connection with this case, the official said.

Addressing a press conference, Mangaluru Police Commissioner Anupam Agarwal stated that the operation stemmed from an earlier arrest six months ago. In September, police apprehended one Haider Ali in Pumpwell, Mangaluru, and confiscated 15 grams of MDMA from him.

Subsequent investigations led authorities to a Nigerian national named Peter, who was arrested

bags, alongside four mobile phones, passports, & Rs 18,000 in cash

in Bengaluru with MDMA worth Rs 6 crore. Further probes pointed to an international drug network with links to traffickers using air routes between Delhi and Bengaluru, he said.

Acting on intelligence, the Mangaluru Central Crime Branch (CCB) police arrested two South African

national -- Bamba Fant (31) and Abigail Adonis (30) -- upon their arrival in Bengaluru on March 14. The suspects were taken into custody in Neeladri Nagar, Electronic City in Bengaluru, the senior police officer said.

## New crew reaches space station, Sunita Williams to be back soon

### Four newcomers will spend the next few days learning the station's ins and outs from Wilmore & Williams

AP, CAPE CANAVERAL: Just over a day after blasting off, a SpaceX crew capsule arrived at the International Space Station on Sunday, delivering the replacements for NASA's two stuck astronauts.

The four newcomers -- representing the US, Japan and Russia -- will spend the next few days learning the station's ins and outs from Butch Wilmore and Sunita Williams.

When the two will strap into their own SpaceX capsule later this week, one that has been up there since last year, to close out an unexpected extended mission that began last June.

Wilmore and Williams expected to be gone just a week

when they launched on Boeing's first astronaut flight. They hit the nine-month mark earlier this month.

The Boeing Starliner capsule encountered so many problems that NASA insisted it come back empty, leaving its test pilots behind to

wait for a SpaceX lift. Wilmore swung open the space station's hatch and then rang the ship's bell as the new arrivals floated in one by one and were greeted with hugs and handshakes.
