Israel strikes Gaza, killing over 400 as ceasefire breaks

DEIR AL-BALAH (GAZA STRIP): Israel launched airstrikes across the Gaza Strip early Tuesday, killing at least 404 Palestinians, including women and children, according to hospital officials.

The surprise bombardment shattered a ceasefire in place since January and threatened to fully reignite the 17-month-old war.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu ordered the strikes after Hamas refused Israeli demands to change the ceasefire agreement. Officials said the operation was open-ended and was expected to expand. The White House said it had been consulted and voiced support for Israel's actions.

Violent protests erupt in Nagpur over Aurangzeb's tomb, curfew imposed

NAGPUR: Tensions escalated in Nagpur after protests against Mughal emperor Aurangzeb's tomb turned violent on Monday night. The unrest prompted authorities to impose a curfew in several areas, while over 50 individuals have been taken into custody.

Stones were thrown at police personnel in the Mahal area, resulting in injuries to 34 officers. Vehicles were set ablaze and chaos engulfed central Nagpur's Chitnis Park locality. To contain the situation, police imposed a curfew at around 4:30 am on Tuesday, restricting movement in parts of the city, including Kotwali, Ganeshpeth and Lakadganj. Only essential services are currently permitted in these zones.

The violence erupted following an agitation led by members of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) and Bajrang Dal, who staged protests demanding the removal of Aurangzeb's tomb located in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar district. The protests included burning an effigy of the Mughal emperor and chanting slogans. According to Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, violence ensued when rumours spread that a holy book had been burnt during the agitation.

Nagpur Police Commissioner Ravinder Kumar Singal confirmed that five First Information Reports (FIRs) have been registered in connection with the violence.
