Jairam hails SC role in fight to save Goa's forests

Says Apex Court's order is only a 'temporary respite', as there is a 'single-minded focus' on freeing up forest lands for real estate

Apex Court says 'forests' being destroyed in Goa'

PANIIM: The battle to save Goa's precious lands from the claws of the land-grabbers got a huge boost on Wednesday when former Environment Minister and Congress leader Jairam Ramesh hailed the Supreme Court directive halting the conversion of Goa's private forest land and said bigger battles lie ahead given the 'single-minded focus' of the Goa Chief Minister to

free up forest lands for real estate purposes.

His sharp criticism comes close on the heels of the March 3 Supreme Court order he referenced in his post on X. On that day, the Apex Court passed an order granting interim relief against the conversion of large tracts identified as forest land by two expert committees.

Much earlier, the National Green Tribunal too had prohibited development of denotified forest land until physical verification of all plots was completed. This was never done. The Supreme Court's

Bandora locals 'breathing and eating dust', thanks to shipyard

Pollution Board officials visit the spot three months after complaint even as Undir locals battle respiratory problems

PONDA: With dust in their food, their homes and their lungs, the residents of Undir in Bandora are living a life that has turned into an unending struggle. Dust pollution due to sand blasting at a nearby ship-building site threatens to upend their lives, leaving their health in

Ironically, local residents had filed a complaint with Goa State Pollution Control Board on December 9. 2024, but officials visited the area only on Tuesday, stating after an inspection that the shipbuilding company had been ordered to take precautionary measures to prevent dust

The shipbuilding activities have been going on for over a year at a dock on the Zuari River, where a large ship is being constructed. The sandblasting process to remove rust from metal is leading to billowing dust

Privanka Naik, a local resident, said that the shipbuilding dock is located directly across from her home. "We are not opposed to shipbuilding, but the sand blasting is creating a lot of dust pollution," Privanka said.

GU EXAM PAPER 'THEFT

Probe panel submits report, but cops still in wait-and-watch mode

Report is with VC and Chancellor; but varsity yet to file complaint, say cops

PANJIM: The two-member fact-finding committee probing the allegation of question paper theft at Goa University submitted its report to Vice-Chancellor Harilal B Menon on Wednesday, who then sent it to the Chancellor, Governor P S Sreedharan Pillai. But curiously, till the evening the police maintained that they had not received a copy, which was apparently preventing them from pushing ahead with their investigation.

The report is supposed to be placed before the university's Executive Committee meeting scheduled on March 28.

The controversy erupted

on Sunday when a complaint was submitted to the Agassaim Police Station, which claimed that an Assistant Professor of the university's School of Physical and Applied Sciences had stolen a Physics question paper to help a girl student in the exams. While the teacher was suspended the next day, police have neither lodged an FIR in the case nor actively sought out the accused teacher or the girl for questioning, stating that they will wait for the report of the fact-finding committee to take their probe forward.

Now, even three days after their complaint was submitted to police by activists lead by Kashinath Shetye, police seem to be in wait-and-watch mode. A police officer pointed out that Goa University has yet to file a complaint. According to the officer, as per BNSS, the police have 14 days to conduct a preliminary enquiry before registering the FIR.

On the other hand, Shetye said that they have now written to SP North to investigate chats of WhatsApp between professors, assistant professor and the said girl student and to get details of call records. He alleged that the university wants to cover up the issue to save the institution's face. He also demanded that a copy of the fact-finding committee report be given to them.

NAGPUR VIOLENCE

8 Bajrang Dal, **VHP** activists surrender; released on bail

PTI, NAGPUR: Eight functionaries of Vishwa Hindu Parishad and Bajrang Dal on Wednesday surren-dered before the Nagpur Police investigating charges of hurting religious sentiments and illegal protest that triggered violence two days back, a senior officer said.

The accused were produced in court, which granted them bail.
