Chahal agrees to pay Rs 4.75 cr alimony to Dhanashree as HC fast-tracks divorce process

MUMBAI: Yuzvendra Chahal has agreed to pay estranged wife Dhanashree Verma Rs 4.75 crore in alimony, with Rs 2.37 crore already paid, Bar and Bench reported. On Wednesday, the Bombay High Court expedited the divorce hearing process for cricketer Yuzvendra Chahal and Dhanashree Verma due to Chahal's



commitments with the Indian Premier League (IPL), which begins on March 22. The hearing is now set for March 20. Yuzvendra Chahal, who is a spinner for the Kings XI Punjab IPL team, is set to join his team, Punjab Kings, for IPL 2025 commencing on March 22. The Bombay High Court waived the mandatory six-month cooling-off period under the Hindu Marriage Act, allowing the couple to proceed with their mutual consent divorce without delay. Yuzvendra Chahal and Dhanashree Verma, who tied the knot in 2020, have been living separately for almost a year now. Their divorce will be finalised tomorrow, March 20.

Two Indian track and field athletes handed 4-year-ban

NEW DELHI: Sprinter Akshay Nain and race walker Aditya Negi have been handed four-year suspensions by the NAĎA's Anti-Doping Disciplinary Panel (ADDP) after they tested positive for steroids. Nain, who had won a silver in 200m and a bronze in 400m at the 2023 National Open, had returned positive for Drostanolone metabolite (3 alpha-hydroxy, 2 alpha-methyl-5 alpha androstan-17-one), will serve a 4-year ban from October 23, 2023. The 24-year-old Nain has personal best of 10.85s (100m), 20.97s (200) and 46.40s (400). Negi, on the other hand, had been under provisional suspension after testing posi-tive for 19-Norandrosterone. His ban period started from February 22, 2024.

Sports Minister calls for inclusion of doping education in schools

NEW DELHI: Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya on Wednesday called for inclusion of doping education in schools and launching awareness campaigns in rural areas to give impetus to the fight against the menace. Delivering his keynote address at the NDTL Annual Conference-2025 on 'Anti-Doping Science: Innovations and Challenges', Mandaviya reaffirmed the government's commitment to promoting clean and fair competition in sports.

Eriksen says he will likely leave Manchester Utd at end of season

COPENHAGEN: Christian Eriksen said on Tuesday he is expecting to leave Manchester United at the end of the season and is ready for a new challenge. The Danish midfielder has been in and out of the team since Ruben Amorim took charge last year and his contract at Old Trafford expires in June. "I'm ready to look for something new. That suits me very well," Eriksen told reporters before Denmark's Nations League quarter-final against Portugal, saying United had not ap-proached him about a possible extension to his deal.

Assam boxers forced to withdraw from Nationals: BFI chief

PTI, NEW DELHI: Boxing Federation of India President Ajay Singh on Wednesday alleged that Assam boxers, including Olympic bronze-winner Lovlina Borgohain, are being stopped from participating in the National Championships by suspended BFI secretary general Hemanta Kalita, who refuted the charge.

In an "emergency press conference" here, Singh said that the Tokyo Games medallist in the 69kg category is keen to participate in the marquee domestic event starting Thursday in Greater Noi-

da but has been asked to withdraw by Kalita.

Kalita, who has been found guilty of financial mismanagement in an inquiry conducted by former Delhi High Court judge Sudhir Kumar Jain, holds the secretary's position in the Assam body.

"Assam is discouraging players from participating in the women's Nationals," Singh said.

"Lovlina has recorded a video of support. But officers have received a call that she has been asked by Hemanta Kalita not to participate. Because she owes a

lot to Assam boxing, she is reconsidering her participation.

"We have been hearing that a lot of tickets are being cancelled (both) train and air," Singh added. However, Kalita said the charges were baseless and the dispute was over the dates of the tournament.

"This is all being done to malign me. I have done no such thing. Since the beginning, state units were unhappy with the dates of the women's nationals. Several states had written to BFI as well," Kalita told PTI.

The BFI has received entries from 22 states but it remains to be

seen how many boxers turn up for the National Championships, being held after close to two years.

Talking about his suspension, Kalita maintained his innocence and said he will be contesting the decision.

"I will be challenging this. If any misappropriation of funds has occurred, the president should be held guilty, as he is the one who signs all the cheques.

"Additionally, it was agreed during the Executive Committee meeting that the Ethics Committee would investigate the matter. Why, then, was a judge appointed

for the task?" he questioned.

Singh, however, insisted that he was well within his rights to call for an investigation.

"When I was asked by the SAI (Sports Authority of India) to look into the complaint, I took the matter to the Executive Committee and said we need to have a proper investigation and they (secretary and treasurer) agreed. They were part of the meeting and agreed.

"The minutes of the EC meeting are available and there was no request for the inquiry to go to the Ethics Commission," Singh said.
