Assam: Class 11, nine papers leaked; exams cancelled

GUWAHATI/BARPETA: The Class 11 Mathematics paper of the Assam state board and Class 9 English paper of Barpeta district were leaked, forcing the authorities to cancel the respective examinations on Thursday and lodge police complaints, officials said. Education Minister Ranaj Pegu in a post on X shared a notification of Assam State School Education Board (ASSEB), which postponed the Mathematics examination. "The Higher Secondary First Year Mathematics exam, scheduled for March 21, 2025 (Afternoon Session), has been postponed due to unavoidable reasons," he added.

Delhi: Woman strangled to death, dumped in Najafgarh drain; two held

NEW DELHI: Two men have been arrested in connection with the murder of a woman who was strangled and dumped in the Najafgarh drain in Dwarka, police said on Thursday. The accused have been identified as Zubair (27) and Asif (26), with the latter having a 12-year-old acquaintance with the victim, Komal (22), they said. Asif and Komal were both residents of Sunder Nagri. Police said on March 12, Asif, a cab driver, picked up Komal in his cab from Seemapuri. They argued after he accused her of being in a relationship with another person. As the argument escalated, he strangled her to death inside the car. Subsequently, he engaged Zubair in disposing of the body. The two tied a rock to the body and threw it in the drain.

Bihar: Union minister's nephew killed in gunfight with brother over drawing tap water BHAGALPUR (BIHAR): A dispute over drawing tap water snowballed into a full-blown gun-battle in a Bihar village on Thursday, leaving Union minister Nityananda Rai's nephew dead and two others – the deceased's mother and brother – seriously injured, police said. The incident took place at Jagatpur village in Naugachia police district adjoining Bhagalpur, where brother duo Vishwajit and Jayjit Yadav picked up a quarrel over drawing water from a tap, Naugachia Superintendent of Police Prerna Kumar said. "As the brothers clashed, their mother tried to intervene. Vishwajit was shot at and died on the spot while his brother and mother were taken to a hospital. Further investigations are underway," she said.

With farmers evicted, traffic at Shambhu border resumes

Khanauri border point also set to open; angry farmers protest

PTI, CHANDIGARH: A day after Punjab Police detained protesting farmers and demolished their temporary structures, traffic resumed on the Shambhu-Ambala Highway on Thursday after more than a year, and Khanauri border point is also set to open, with Haryana Police removing roadblocks on their side of the road. The road clearance exercise continued even as angry farmers held protests at several places in Punjab including Moga, Tarn Taran, Muktsar and Faridkot against the last evening crackdown on the protesters.

A group of farmers, including women, entered into a scuffle with police personnel in Moga while on their way to hold a protest outside the deputy commissioner's office. Meanwhile, in a statement issued in Delhi, the Aam Aadmi Party reaffirmed its support to farmers but emphasised the urgent need to reopen key roads to protect Punjab's economy.

The protesting farmers lashed out at the AAP government for detaining their leaders and removing protesters from the Shambhu and Khanauri border points, where they had been camping since Feb 13 last year after their march to Delhi was thwarted by security personnel. As the protests got stretched, farmers built temporary structures on the highway to accommodate protesters and sustain their agitation.

Haryana Police had fortified the border points with cement blocks, iron nails and barbed wire to scuttle any attempt by the farmers from Punjab to move towards the national capital. Thus, the traffic on the Shambhu-Ambala and Sangrur-Jind roads remained closed for over a year.

On Thursday, security personnel from Haryana removed the cement barricades on their side of

Shambhu-Ambala Highway, opening the road for traffic, while barricading on the road at the Khanauri border point is still being removed. Earlier in the day, Punjab Police resumed its operation to dismantle the remaining part of the temporary structures on the Punjab side of the Shambhu and the Khanauri points to clear the roads. Police took trolleys to an open ground so farmers could

later take them by showing their identity proofs. Meanwhile, farmers claimed that those detained have started a hunger strike in protest against the police action. The Samyukta Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha – the two organisations spearheading the protests – have announced to hold dharnas outside the offices of deputy commissioners in protest against the Punjab Police crackdown.

Chhattisgarh: 30 Naxalites, cop killed in 2 encounters

PTI, BIJAPUR/KANKER: In a fresh offensive against Naxals, security forces killed at least 30 members of the banned CPI (Maoist) in two separate encounters in Chhattisgarh's Bastar region on Thursday, officials said.

While 26 Naxalites were killed in Bijapur district, four Maoists were gunned down in Kanker by a joint team of the BSF and District Reserve Guard (DRG) personnel of the state police.

A police jawan was also killed in the encounter in Bijapur, the officials said.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah said the security forces have achieved another big success in their march to make the country Naxal-free with the two encounters.

"The Modi government is moving forward with a ruthless approach against Naxalites and is adopting a zero tolerance policy against those Naxalites who are not surrendering despite all the facilities being offered to them, ranging

from surrender to inclusion. The country is going to be Naxal-free by March 31 next year," Shah wrote on 'X' in Hindi.

An official said a gunfight broke out around 7 am in a forest along the border of Bijapur and Dantewada districts when a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Naxalite operation in Gangaloor police station area in Bijapur.

The bodies of 26 Naxalites besides firearms and explosives were recovered from the spot, Inspector General of Police, Bastar Range Sundarraj P told PTI.

A jawan of the DRG unit was also killed in the gunfight, he said.

Another encounter took place in the morning in a forest along the border of Kanker and Narayanpur districts when a joint team of the DRG and Border Security Force (BSF) was out on an anti-Naxal operation, Kanker Superintendent of Police Indira Kalyan Elesela said.

The bodies of four Naxalites and automatic weapons were recovered following the action, he said.

Search operations were underway at both the encounter sites, police said.

RS adjourned over DMK MPs wearing T-shirts

PTI, NEW DELHI: Rajya Sabha failed to transact any significant business on Thursday and was adjourned for the day after witnessing three adjournments over a row on some DMK members wearing T-shirts with slogans written on them.

This is the first day during the second part of the Budget Session when the House was adjourned without transacting any business except for the laying of papers.

Soon after the House met in the morning, Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar allowed the laying of papers and some reports of the parliamentary standing committees, after which he adjourned the House for about an hour.

He said he wanted to meet leaders of political parties over what he witnessed in the House. Without sharing details of what he witnessed, Dhankhar adjourned the proceedings till noon.
