**Subramanian stuns World No. 2 in Swiss Open; Treasa-Gayatri in semis**

**BASEL:** India's Sankar Muthusamy Subramanian caused a major upset by knocking out World No. 2 Anders Antonsen of Denmark in a thrilling three-game contest to reach the men's singles quarterfinals of the Swiss Open Super 300 badminton tournament here. The 21-year-old from Tamil Nadu, a silver medalist at the 2022 World Junior Championships and currently ranked 64th in the world, put up an impressive display of defense to defeat the three-time World Championships medalist 18-21, 21-12, 21-5 in a 66-minute contest. Later, Treasa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand stormed into the women's semi-finals with a clinical 21-18, 21-14 win over Hong Kong's Pui Lam Yeung and Nga Ting Yeung. Next, Subramanian will face World No. 31 Christo Popov of France, a 2019 World Junior Championships silver medalist.

**British ace Peter Wilson appointed Indian trap shooting coach**

**NEW DELHI:** The National Rifle Association of India (NRAI) has appointed renowned British shooter Peter Wilson as the foreign coach of the national trap team. Interestingly, Wilson, a gold medalist at the London Olympics 2012, had applied for the same job last year, right after the Paris Games. According to a top NRAI official, Wilson will be working with the Indian trap shooters for 180 days in a year. "That's how it is at the moment. He will be in India for 180 days in a year, but his contract will be renewed annually," the official told PTI on Friday. Meanwhile, talks are headed in the right direction as far as the appointment of Riccardo Filippelli for the job of the skeet coach is concerned.

**Gymnastics: Nayak qualifies for vault final in FIG World Cup**

**NEW DELHI:** Indian gymnast Pranati Nayak has qualified for the Vault final after securing a third place in the qualification round at the FIG Apparatus World Cup in Antalya, Turkey. The 29-year-old, who represented the country at the Tokyo Olympics, came up with an aggregate score of 13.317 in the vault qualification. She finished behind the American duo of Jayla Hang (13.783) and Claire Pease (13.584). The Vault final is scheduled on Saturday. "Pranati did well in the qualification and with better execution, she can be a medal prospect in the finals," her coach Ashok Kumar Mishra told PTI.

**Nawaz smacks record-breaking maiden ton as Pakistan win 3rd NZ T20**

**AUCKLAND:** Opener Hasan Nawaz struck a record-breaking maiden century Friday as Pakistan crushed New Zealand by nine wickets in the third Twenty20 to keep the series alive. After scoring a duck in each of the two opening games -- the first innings' of his international career -- Nawaz rebounded with a stunning 105 not out in Auckland as the tourists raced to 207-1 in response to New Zealand's 204. The 23-year-old's ton came off 44 balls, the fastest by any Pakistan player in a T20 international. It ensured his team reached the target with four full overs to spare, in a stark reversal of form after heavy losses in Christchurch and Dunedin. Nawaz put his early failures behind him with a sparkling knock featuring shots all around the wicket, including a series of audacious ramp shots.

**Spain grab late leveller against Dutch in Nations League, Croatia down France**

**PARIS:** Mikel Merino's 93rd-minute equaliser earned Spain a 2-2 draw against the Netherlands in Nations League quarter-final first leg action on Thursday, while Croatia have one foot in the semi-finals after beating France 2-0. Germany are in prime position to host the final stage of the tournament after coming from behind to beat Italy 2-1 in Milan while Rasmus Hojlund fired Denmark into a slender first-leg lead against Portugal. In Rotterdam, reigning champions Spain raced into an early lead through Nico Williams but needed an injury-time leveller against the 10 men of the Netherlands to salvage their two-year unbeaten streak. **Japan first to seal World Cup spot as South Korea, Australia, Iran get closer**

**HONG KONG:** Japan became the first team to qualify for the 2026 World Cup on Thursday as South Korea were held but still inched closer along with a rampant Australia and a dominant Iran. Daichi Kamada and Takefusa Kubo scored in the second half to give Japan a 2-0 home win over Bahrain and take their place alongside hosts the United States, Canada and Mexico at next year's finals. It will be their eighth straight World Cup appearance. Australia remain in pole position to qualify with Japan. Japan lead on 19 points, with Australia second on 10 points, one clear of Saudi Arabia and four of Indonesia, Bahrain and China. The top two go straight to North America, with teams finishing third and fourth in the three Asian groups going into a further round of qualifying.
