UP: Gambling racket run by women busted, six arrested

PTI, BAREILLY: Six women were arrested for allegedly running an illegal gambling operation in a residential area in Uttar Pradesh's Bareilly, police said on Monday.

Based on a tip-off, a police patrol team raided the location in Sanjay Nagar in Baradari area and caught the accused while gambling with playing cards, they said.



Carbine magazines, grenades seized as security forces intensify anti-terror operation in Kathua

PTI, JAMMU: A cache of incriminating material, including several loaded magazines of M4 carbine assault rifles and a couple of grenades, were seized as security forces intensified their search to neutralise a group of infiltrating terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district on Monday, officials said.

The operation, personally led by Director General of Police Nalin Prabhat, was launched on Sunday evening in the Hiranagar sector. It was intensified with additional deployment of commandos, drones and sniffer dogs on Monday morning, they said.

An army helicopter was also seen hovering over the area later in the day.

operation launched by police with a Special Operations Group after they got intelligence about the presence of terrorists inside a 'dhok' -- a local term for an enclosure -- in a nursery of Sanyal village, approximately five

kilometres from the Pakistan border, the officials said.

The terrorists launched a barrage of fire at the police party, leading to an intense gunfight that lasted more than half an hour, they said.

A seven-year-old girl suffered minor injuries when a stray bullet passed close to her arm. She was admitted to a local hospital.

Reinforcements swiftly dispatched and a manhunt was launched to apprehend the terrorists, believed to have infiltrated on Saturday either via the ravine route or through a new tunnel.

There was no report of casualties in the initial firing and the area was kept under a tight security cordon throughout the night before the forces moved in at the crack of dawn, the officials said.

Ruckus in Assam Assembly as BJP alleges Dy Speaker attacked by Cong MLA

PTI. GUWAHATI: The Assam Assembly on Monday witnessed uproarious scenes with the ruling BJP alleging that Deputy Speaker Numal Momin was attacked by Congress MLA Nurul Huda just outside the House, leading to adjourn-

Huda, however, claimed he did not assault Momin but blocked the way to the House during a protest.

The Congress legislators attended the assembly wearing black clothes to protest against BJP MLA Rupjyoti Kurmi, who verbally abused opposition MLAs and tried to physicallv assault them inside the House last week.

Before the session start-

ed, the Congress legislators held a sit-in in the corridor leading to the Speaker and Deputy Speaker's chambers in the assembly building demanding action against Kurmi

"I received a WhatsApp message from Momin in which he said he was attacked by Nurul Huda and he is now hospitalised. I request the Speaker to register a police complaint as it happened outside the House and let the police investigate the matter," Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said during the Question Hour.

Moments before that, Momin was seen sitting inside the House and attending the session. He left the House after some time. Speaker Biswajit Daimary said he has asked the officials to check the matter.

Reacting to the CM's allegations, Leader of the Opposition Debabrata Saikia demanded that instead of the police, a House Committee be formed to investigate the matter as the incident was reported to have taken place inside the assembly building.

Opposition MLAs of the Congress, AIUDF and CPI(M) trooped into the Well of the House, showing placards and protesting against Kurmi and the ruling party's statement regarding the alleged attack on Momin.

Noisy scenes in Odisha Assembly, House adjourned several times
