# OPPOSITION TURNS THE HEAT ON TOURISM MIN OVER FOREIGN TRIPS

Questions whether they benefit Goa or are a waste of taxpayers' money

**PORVORIM:** The Opposition members on Wednesday cornered Tourism Minister Rohan Khaunte in the Goa Legislative Assembly for spending crores of rupees on foreign trips.

However, Khaunte defended the Department of Tourism's participation, stressing the importance of Goa's presence at global platforms to boost the State's international tourism profile.

Quepem MLA Altone D'Costa raised concerns over the Department of Tourism's foreign trips, questioning their value and whether they truly benefit Goa or are simply a waste of taxpayers' money. He expressed his skepticism about the effectiveness of these international events in promoting Goa's tourism. He said that the government had spent Rs 1 crore on foreign trips and asked whether these trips were really to promote tourism or junkets.

In response, Khaunte emphasised that such participation is crucial for showcasing Goa to a broader audience and attracting more tourists and for positioning.

## BIG FIGHT

He also reassured the House that a proper tendering process was followed for all foreign trips undertaken by the department, ensuring transparency and accountability in these expenditures. This exchange highlights the ongoing debate about the value of international engagement and the responsible use of public funds in promoting Goa's tourism.

The Minister told the House that agencies involved in these initiatives are empanelled under A and B categories, selected through a structured ten-

## TEMPERS FLARE OVER 'INCORRECT AND INADEQUATE DATA' ON TOURISM

**PANJIM:** The Goa Legislative Assembly on Wednesday witnessed a heated debate between Tourism Minister Rohan Khaunte and Sant Andre MLA Viresh Borkar with the latter alleging "incorrect and inadequate data" in answers to his starred question on the tourism plan to attract high-end tourists in the State.

Borkar walked into the well of the house in protest. Tempers flared when Borkar, who had tabled a starred question on the tourism plan to attract high-end tourists in the State, sought to know the details of the amount spent on upgradation of tourism infrastructure by the Tourism Department in the last three years. He demanded to

know whether new tourist landmarks have been identified and developed. But Khaunte said that information cannot be furnished in view of Rule 37 of The Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business of the Goa Legislative Assembly. The MLA was annoyed when the Minister stated that country-wise data from 2023 onwards was not available as the source agencies submitted only the consolidated data of international tourist arrivals. Borkar also sought to know how much amount was spent on road shows, events, study tours, social media promotion, television and radio and which markets were tapped to attract high-end tourists to the State.

According to the Incredible India 2024 report, the United States (US) ranks second in tourist footfall across India and fourth highest in Goa, highlighting the State's growing appeal

among global travellers.

Opposition MLAs highlighted that between 2019 and 2023, Rs 40 crore were spent from the State exchequer on foreign trips by the Department. They also sought to know whether these foreign trips were approved through a ten-

dering process or nomination basis or post-facto approval.

The opposition members also stated that the Minister had not furnished details of his OSD (officer on special duty) who travelled foreign countries. The Minister told them that the

bill was yet to be settled since 2023 and therefore the expenses had not been reflected in the reply. He also said that the bills of the travel by the Secretary (Tourism) were also not settled and pending due to political clearance issues.

Pointing to decline in tourists from Scandinavian countries, Benaulim MLA Venzy Viegas asked whether the government has taken feedback from tourists from Scandinavian countries on what Goa needs to do to bring back high-end tourists.

The Minister said that the government is actively promoting tourism beyond the beaches, with a strong focus on developing hinterland destinations. He also disclosed the government's plan to introduce the Airline Incentives Scheme only for emerging markets aiming to boost Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTA) and establish Goa as a premier travel hub, attracting high-spending visitors.

In compliance with the High Court order on March 6, the Directorate of Panchayats and Department of Municipal Administration have issued instructions village panchayats, and CCP and municipal councils respectively, across the State to identify and initiate actions against such illegal constructions.

### Govt must regulate overseas recruiting agencies: MLA

**PORVORIM:** Expressing his concern over duping of youths seeking jobs abroad, Mormugao MLA Sankalp Amonkar on Wednesday urged the government to monitor and regulate the overseas recruiting agencies.

Raising the matter during Zero Hour in the Legislative Assembly, Amonkar drew the attention of the House to the growing concerns of the people regarding the activities of recruitment agencies in the State of Goa, particularly those involved in facilitating overseas employment for our citizens.

He said that there has been an alarming increase in reports of some agencies taking advantage of the desperation of our youth and job-seekers. These agencies are allegedly engaging in unethical practices, including charging exorbitant fees, providing misleading information about job offers, and failing to fulfil contractual agreements with the workers. As a result, many Goans have found themselves stranded in foreign countries with no support or means of return.

### 'Licence fee hike additional burden on bar owners'

**PORVORIM:** Mormugao MLA Sankalp Amonkar on Wednesday said that 100 per cent increase in license fees charged on the licence issued and also on its renewals was adding pressure and additional financial burden on the bar owners in the State. Amonkar said that as per the notification issued by the government in June 2024, there is 100 per cent additional licence fees charged on the licence issued and also on its renewals. The bar owners across the State are facing competitions from the wholesale outlets, apart from paying for other licences from the authorities such as local bodies, food and drugs, legal metrology, electricity, etc. The Bar Owners who are covered under this notification also face stiff competition from the ones who are not covered in view of no uniformity. He urged the government to immediately withdraw the notification and to safeguard their livelihood.

## Tourist Info Mgmt System must for hotels: Min

**PORVORIM:** Tourism Minister Rohan Khaunte on Wednesday announced that the TIME (Tourist Information Management System) software will be mandatory for all hotels and accommodations starting April 1 this year, ensuring comprehensive data collection on tourist arrivals in the State.

In the last quarter of 2024 (from October to December), Goa recorded 100 per cent occupancy, with flights operating at full capacity, contributing to an average tourism growth of 22 per cent in 2024, Khaunte said.

He added that this surge was a result of proactive engagement with stakeholders, strategic discussions with Chief Minister Pramod Sawant, and a commitment to prioritising quality over quantity in tourism.

By leveraging real-time data analytics, the government will gain deep insights into visitor demographics, travel patterns, and emerging trends, allowing for strategic interventions and a seamless hospitality eco-system.

## Economic survey pegs growth at 14%

**PANJIM:** The Economic Survey 2024-25, tabled in the Goa Legislative Assembly by Chief Minister Pramod Sawant, has projected Goa's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at Rs 1,21,309.02 crore for 2024-25, with an anticipated growth of 13.87 per cent.

According to the report, the growth is mainly due to anticipated resumption of mining and quarrying activities after auctioning of mining leases in the State and various infrastructure projects undertaken by the govt.

Incidentally, in 2023-24, the GSDP grew by 13.73%, reaching Rs 1,06,532.57 crore. Per capita income has also risen from Rs 4.85 lakh in 2019-20 to Rs 6.74 lakh in

2023-24, states the Survey. It said that the Credit Deposit Ratio (CDR) of the State as on September 30, 2024, was 32.66 per cent, an increase from 31.86 per cent during the same period in the previous year.

The Survey said as per budget estimates 2024-25, the revenue surplus was Rs 1,720.19 crore, the Fiscal Deficit estimated to be Rs 3,149.47 crore and the capital receipts estimated at Rs 4,326.66 crore.

The internal debt of the state for the year 2024-25 was estimated at Rs 3,750.20 crore, the Survey said.

It said the State witnessed a declining trend in decadal growth of population which stood at 8.23 per cent in 2011 Census as compared to 15.21% in 2001 Census.
