Bar leaders meet CJI against Justice Varma's transfer

PTI, NEW DELHI: Leaders of six High Court bar associations on Thursday met Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna and sought withdrawal of the recommendation to transfer Delhi High Court judge Yashwant Varma to the Allahabad High Court.

Soon after the meeting, Allahabad High Court Bar Association (AHCBA) president Anil Tiwari said the CJI had assured them of considering the demands.

However, the CJI did not promise anything, said sources privy to the development. The representatives of six High

Court bar associations met the CJI and four collegium members, Justices B R Gavai, Surya Kant, Abhay S Oka and Vikram Nath.

They raised several demands, including setting in motion criminal action over the cash discovery from the judge's official home.

"The five members (of the collegium) listened to us carefully and told us in a positive way 'each and every point raised by you in writing will be considered by us strictly within the premises of law." Tiwari said.

After HC order, govt lens on illegal structures along highways

Notices soon to illegal establishments along National and State Highways

PANJIM: The State government has initiated the process of issuing notices to roadside commercial establishments operating in illegal temporary or permanent structures within 15-metre setback of National and State Highways, directing them to shift/relocate within 15 days.

"This action is in compliance with the order of the High Court of Bombay at Goa dated March 6," said Chief Minister Pramod Sawant after chairing a High-Powered Committee meeting at Porvorim on Thursday.

Ministers Aleixo Sequeira, Atanasio 'Babush' Monserrate and Rohan Khaunte, along with Advocate General Devidas Pangam, secretaries to the government and other officials were present.

Sawant said, "Government is not issuing these orders on its own. They are being issued in compliance with High Court orders. Notices will be issued to the roadside commercial establishments asking them

The Chief Minister disclosed that the government is considering taking a policy decision or enacting a new legislation before the next Assembly session to provide major relief to irregular structures across the State.

"Along with Advocate General Devidas Pangam, the government will appoint a legal firm to study the High Court order and related laws to frame new rules and regulations to give relief to people as promised in the Legislative Assembly," Sawant informed.

Columbia varsity let me down: Selfdeported Indian student feels betrayed

AGENCY, NEW DELHI: Indian PhD student Ranjani Srinivasan, who self-deported herself to Canada after her student visa, was revoked on allegations of 'supporting Hamas', is feeling betraved by Columbia University.

Srinivasan said she never expected her institution to let her down, but that is exactly what she feels it did, she revealed in an interview with Al Jazeera.

"I spent five years at Columbia, working - I don't know - maybe 100 hours a week sometimes. I never expected the institution to let me down. But it did," she said in the interview.

Srinivasan, who was pursuing her doctorate in public planning before the Donald Trump administration accused her of 'supporting Hamas' and revoked her visa that was renewed in December last year, is still hopeful the university will consider her appeal and reinstate her enrollment.

"I hope Columbia comes to its senses and re-enrolls me. All the requirements for my PhD are complete, and whatever is left, I don't even need to be in the US for. So I'm trying to appeal to Columbia to do that," she added.

Ranjani Srinivasan, a doctoral student at Columbia University in New York, first got an email from the United States consulate in Chennai on March 5, stating that her student visa had been revoked.

While the 37-year-old was still trying to make sense of it all, contacting her PhD group and the university authorities, ICE agents showed up at her door.

US homeland security secretary Kristi Noem accused her of being a "terrorist sympathiser" in a

PANJIM: Conversations in Goa surround the weather these days, and mostly for the wrong reasons. The heat is truly on and what makes it nearly unbearable is the sweltering humidity. One natural, almost inevitable fallout has been the steady increase in AC sales. Most appliance store managers report an increase of sales to the tune of 15-20% during this summer season, when compared with their sales figures last year.

"A 50-50 ratio can be seen on the sales of new and replacement ACs," said Kaushik Talaulikar, owner of an electrical appliance store in Panjim. A combination of record sales and rising costs has turned the air conditioning market into one of the hottest sectors in the consumer durables field.
