player this season. He also backed up his performances with a return of four goals and three assists. The 23-year-old showed all the qualities of being one of the pillars of the East Bengal FC team for the future.

Luka Majcen (Puniab FC)



The Shers' Mr Consistent delivered yet again notching up ten goals and three assists to his name. He missed a few games due to injury without which his tallies could
