UP police busts occult gang in Sambhal; 14 held for fraud, sexual exploitation

SAMBHAL: A gang that duped people with promises of 'Dhan Varsha' through occult rituals and sexually exploited women and girls under the guise of performing rites has been busted in Uttar Pradesh's Sambhal, police claimed on Thursday. Fourteen members of the gang, which was active for the past 7 to 8 years across Etah, Agra, and Firozabad, have been apprehended and sent to jail, Sambhal Superintendent of Police (SP) Krishna Kumar Bishnoi said. The case came to light on March 21 when Rajpal approached Dhanari police station, alleging that he was taken to an undisclosed location under the pretense of an occult ritual and barely escaped with his life, Bishnoi said. Police registered a case of kidnapping and attempted murder following his complaint.

Escaping from dogs, man falls into well in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar

CHHATRAPATI SAMBHAJINAGAR: A man was stuck in a well for almost 48 hours after he fell into it while trying to save himself from a pack of dogs in Kannad in Maharashtra's Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar district, a police official said on Friday. Sandip Ghatkawde (30) managed to survive by holding on to a rope tied to the edge of the well before he was rescued on Thursday, the Pishor police station official added. "At round 4pm on Tuesday, Ghatkawde fell into a 60-foot deep well, which had water till the 10-feet mark, while trying to save himself from dogs. No one saw him fall into the well and his voice would not carry to passersby, leaving him stranded in a precarious position," the official said. "At around 2pm on Thursday, some children from the vicinity came to the well in search of a honevcomb.

Rajastham CM gets death threat from

JAIPUR: Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma received a death threat from a jailed man on Friday morning, police said. This is the fourth time in 14 months that the CM has received a death threat. He allegedly called the Bikaner Police Control Room from a mobile phone and claimed that he would kill the chief minister, SP Kavendra Singh Sagar said. Police reached the Bikaner Central Jail and detained Adil. His motive and how he got hold of a phone is being investigated, the SP said. He said Adil is a drug addict with some mental health issues and has slit his hands previously. The mobile phone was recovered from him. On Wednesday, Deputy CM Prem Chand Bairwa also received a death threat from a Jaipur Central Jail inmate. Three people were detained by the police the next day.

Fire breaks out in girls hostel in Greater Noida

NOIDA: A fire broke out in a girls' hostel in Greater Noida on Thursday evening after an air conditioner (AC) compressor exploded, an official said. No fatalities were reported, but one girl was injured while attempting to escape the fire. The incident occurred in Annapurna Girls Hostel in Knowledge Park 3 after an air AC compressor exploded on the second floor of the building, said Pradeep Kumar, Noida chief fire officer (CFO), on Friday. "The injured girl was admitted to a hospital. She is better now," he added. According to the fire official, as soon as the fire broke out, smoke spread throughout the building, resulting in chaos among the 160 students residing there.

Delhi Police rescues Jharkhand teen trafficked on pretext of job

NEW DELHI: A 17-year-old girl allegedly trafficked from Jharkhand under the pretext of employment was rescued by the Delhi Police from the Rani Bagh area, an official said on Friday. The victim was reported missing by her father who filed a complaint at Rai Deeh police station in Jharkhand's Gumla district, he said. A case under Sections 137(2) (kidnapping), 143(4) (trafficking), and 146 (unlawful compulsory labour) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita was registered on March 1. "The girl was lured to Delhi on the promise of a job but was instead trafficked. On receiving a request for assistance, our team worked swiftly to trace and rescue her," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime) Vikram Singh said.

UP: Two brothers sentenced to life in 16-year-old murder case

BAREILLY (UP): A court in Bareilly district has sentenced two brothers to life imprisonment for a murder committed 16 years ago, and imposed a fine of Rs 22,000 on each of them, Additional District Government Advocate (ADGC) Reetram Rajput said on Friday. Two others accused in the case were acquitted over lack of evidence.

RS Chairman Dhankar walks out of **Business Advisory Committee meet**

Opposition members claimed he left midway due to sharp differences between them and ruling MPs on issues to be taken up

PTI, NEW DELHI: Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar walked out of a meeting of the Business Advisory Committee (BAC) Friday, with House sources saying that a "lack of decorum" was the reason, but Opposition members claimed he left midway due to sharp differences between them and ruling MPs on issues to be taken up.

According to an opposition leader, the Chairman walked out due to disagreements between ruling and opposition members over the demand for a discussion on "duplicate" voter id (EPIC) numbers, and sending bills for scrutiny by parliamentary committees.

Rajya Sabha sources, however, insisted the EPIC (Electors Photo Identification Card) issue was time for debates on issues

According to an opposition leader, the Chairman walked out due to disagreements between ruling and opposition members over the demand for a discussion on "duplicate" voter id (EPIC) numbers, and sending bills for scrutiny by parliamentary committees

not discussed. They said Dhankhar decided to walkout as the government and opposition members refused to budge from their respective position on these issues.

The BAC meeting was called to decide the business for the Upper House for the coming week. According to the senior

opposition leader quoted above, their MPs wanted the government to fix the like EPIC cards, the Manipur situation abd scrutiny of bills. Opposition leaders insisted they are giving notices everyday for discussions on different issues, however, no time was being allotted for those.

opposition MPs The stressed while they supported government business, the issues they are seeking to discuss are not being listed, leading to a standoff between the rival members.

Amid the disagreement,

the Chairman walked out of the meeting, the leader said. Another opposition leader, meanwhile, said they have conveyed to the Chair-

man that they are flexible on the rules under which discussion on EPIC can be held, as well as the wording of the notice, but the discussion should be taken up.

The Trinamool Congress, which has been raising the issue continuously in the House with multiple MPs giving notices almost every day, has warned of protests if the debate is not take up in Parliament.

The BAC meeting was convened on a day heated exchanges were witnessed in the Upper House between treasury and opposition benches over remarks made by Samajwadi Party leader Ramji Lal Suman.

Gujarat HC grants 3-month bail to Asaram on medical grounds

AHMEDABAD: PTI, The Gujarat High Court

on Friday granted fresh temporary bail for three months to self-styled godman Asaram, who is serving life imprisonment in a rape case, on medical grounds following a split verdict.

The Supreme Court had on January 7 granted interim bail to Asaram till March 31 in this case registered by the Gujarat police. At present, he is undergoing ayurvedic treatment in Jodhpur, Rajasthan. As the three-month peri-

od was coming to an end on Monday, his lawyers moved the high court seeking bail for another three months, starting from April 1. The matter came up be-

fore a division bench of Justice Ilesh J Vora and Justice Sandeep Bhatt earlier in the day. After hearing both sides,

the bench gave a split ver-



dict as Justice Vora granted him bail while Justice Bhatt expressed a dissenting view and dismissed the application.

The matter was then listed before a third judge, Justice A S Supehia, in the afternoon.

His lawyer senior advocate Shalin Mehta argued that 86-year-old Asaram was suffering from heart and kidney ailments, and the only treatment available to him was ayurvedic `panchakarma'.

The treatment at a Jodhpur-based ayurvedic facility had only just begun and would take another three months, the lawyer said.

Not all AI apps are safe, tech prone to attacks: Cyber advisory

PTI, NEW DELHI: Not all Artificial Intelligence (AI) apps are safe and users signing up for them should consider using an anonymous account not linked to their personal or professional identity, India's federal cyber security agency has advised.

In its advisory, the Computer Emergency Response Team of India (CERT-In), the national technology arm to guard the Indian Internet space and combat cyberattacks, has underlined "vulnerabilities" in AI design, training and interaction mechanism.

The "vulnerabilities" the latest advisory talks about include technical issues such as data poisoning,

adversarial attacks, model inversion, prompt injection and hallucination exploitation.

"Not all AI applications out there are safe," says the advisory, accessed by PTI. Artificial Intelligence has

become a hallmark of innovation, revolutionising industries ranging from healthcare to communications and it is increasingly used to handle activities traditionally undertaken by humans, it says. The advisory says AI

has accelerated automating of routine tasks, fostering creativity and supporting business functions such as customer services, logistics, medical diagnosis, and cybersecurity.

Muslims in Patna protest Waqf Bill with black armbands during Friday prayers

PTI, PATNA: A large number of Muslims here wore black armbands during Jummah prayers on the last Friday of Ramzan in protest against the Waqf (Amendment) Bill.

Black armbands were distributed outside Jama Masjid (near Patna railway station) and Dariyapur mosque before the prayers, following an appeal by the All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB).

In a post on X, the AIM-PLB stated, "The AIMPLB appeals to all Muslims to wear a black armband while coming to the mosque on Jumu'atul Wida as a silent and peaceful expression of grief and protest. It is the responsibility of every Muslim in the country to strongly oppose this Waqf Amendment Bill".

Customer can pay service charge on food bills voluntarily, restaurants can't impose it: Delhi HC

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court on Friday held the payment of service charge on food bills was voluntary and restaurants couldn't impose it on

customers. Pronouncing the verdict, Justice Prathiba M Singh dismissed two petitions of the restaurant bodies challenging the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) guidelines prohibiting hotels and restaurants from mandatorily levying

service charge on food bills.

sumers rights and contrary to law and consumers were not barred from tipping voluntarily if they wished to do so, the court held.

The court added the mandatory collection of service charge on food bills was "misleading" and "deceptive" as it gave an impression to the consumers that they were imposed in the form of service tax or GST.

Such a practice amounts to "unfair trade practice" and the amount cannot be mandatorily added in the

hill, it said. Federation of Hotels and Restaurant Associations of

India (FHRAI) and National Restaurant Association of India (NRAI) had moved the court in 2022 by filing two separate petitions.

The court upheld the guidelines and imposed Rs 1 lakh cost each on the petitioners to be deposited with the CCPA towards consumer welfare. Underscoring society's

interest as paramount, the court said the rights of consumers as a class would prevail over the rights of restaurants.

The court held that the CCPA was not merely an advisory body but was em-

powered to issue guidelines said the CCPA had no powfor prevention of unfair trade practices and for protecting consumer interest.

The CCPA is an authority empowered to pass the guidelines under CPA 2019. Issuing guidelines is an essential function of CCPA. The same has to be mandatorily complied with by all the restaurants, the court said.
